ANCIENT HISTORY OF MALINDI.

Extracts from An Old Geography Book.

PROBABLY REFERS TO ODEE.

[STANDARD CORRESPONDENT.] Malindi, January 7. The following is the text in a Seventeenth Century Geography Book of Malindi, then called "Malinda."

"In this city bears the name of the kingdom, seated in a beautiful and delightful soil, yielding great plenty of rice, millet, fruit; good sorts of Peas, Lemons, Citrons, oranges, etc. But not well furnished with corn."

"The city is fair, well walled, and the houses built after the style of the country, the Peas and Lemons. The inhabitants are of the Arabian breed and of the same religion."

"Those inland are for the most part heathen, and of an olive colour, but inclining to white. All their weapons are of very white complexion. They are said to be more civil in their habits, course of life and entertainment in their houses than the rest of this country, and great friends to the Portuguese, who returns the like usage to them."

"This kingdom of Malinda is not the least from Malacca, above 80 leagues by land and 60 by sea, whose people are of the same native and disposition with those of Malinda."

The Estates of Lamu, Pate and Chindia are under the government of Malinda. Panhathra, King of Lamu, and brother to the King of Chindia, surprised in 1600 both Brito, Governor of Malinda, and some other Portuguese, whom they sold to the Turks. The Admiral Thomas Boman Colombo assumed them, took and cut off the head of the King of Lamu, quartered the skulls and hung them up in divers places to serve for example.

"These Kings are almost all Mahomedan; yet have we found some few Christians which inhabit among them."

Solution of Ode.

This extract from a fine old geography of the first half of the Seventeenth Century gives rise to a possible solution of the problem of Ode.

Although Great, a locality inland near Kilifi, is mentioned and Mombasa and Lamu, no mention

is made of any city, either flourishing or in ruins, in the vicinity of Ode.

Ode was a walled city; there is no trace or tradition of walls round the present town of Malindi. There is a story that Vasco da Gama changed the name of the town, he found it in this district, and called it Malinda after his wife. This suggests a possibility and even probability that Ode was the walled city of the Kingdom of Malinda, and that it was, actually, the flourishing city referred to in the geography book above.

Moreover the presence of kopholes suitable for cross-bows or muskets is a further proof that the walls of the place were of the date mentioned in the text.

The surrounding soil is very fertile, as the heavy forest bears witness. The approach from the sea was possible, but also easy to defend.

Old the present town of Malindi, then, formerly served only as a small port for Ode, and since the traditional sack of Ode grew into the principal town. At Malindi there is no trace of a great Sultan's palace, such as there is at Gedi; and the Sultan or Governor must undoubtedly have been a person with much power and wealth, as then under the control of the Kingdom of Malindi.

Old Odean

attain the higher Standard of these.

Dr. Brown who has been responsible for the teaching of Zoology to the 2nd Year, says that on the whole the class is satisfactory. He finds the English of the Medical section of this class better than those of the previous years. The Agricultural and Veterinary sections is not so good, but they know more than they think they can usually give an answer to any question which is asked.

The difficulty in this course has been that up to the present the best students have been those who had been to the Agricultural and Veterinary sections and the results of the Agricultural work cannot therefore compare too favourably with those of the other sections. Veterinary.

One 1st Year boy has been with the Veterinary Department most of this year and is believed to have improved very much. The Department's difficulties have been many, but these are being done and arrangements are being made to give the 2nd year students a really good training next year.

Schoolmasters.

This class remains one of the most important at the present stage of the country's development. A class of 10 has just completed its finals, and the results are good. It is 9 1st classes and 6 2nd classes.

There is also a class of 14 entering on the small year in February. The Master of Method considers that although individuals of the 1927 class were higher than those of the later years, the average level of the latter is higher than that of the former. This is due to the fact that the latter have had more opportunity to understand and write English.

I am confident that they will have the best teaching offered in the various parts of the Province to which they may be going.

Engineering and Survey Classes.

The Engineering Class—a unit of nine boys is somewhat in the nature of an experiment. They are about half way through their course and most of them are, in addition, when qualified, for work with the Public Works Department.

There has been a decided improvement in many of their subjects this year and I think the top half of the class will justify the experiment.

Clubs.

The clubs course is an interesting experiment, which promises well and I am glad to report that at the end of next year when they complete their course, I hope to be able to provide some promising material for the requirements of the University, but a satisfactory progress has been made and the outlook is very bright, at any rate for the first 20. There is, however, a great disparity between the top and lower half of the class.

Again a considerable large class of 51 students. The material class is up to better than previous years. The improvement made in the last few years at the various Intermediate Schools will shortly be making itself felt, and from now on each year should bring a better "folder". Their first year examinations closed.

English—Higher standard than formerly.

Maths—Still notable.

These boys will begin their various vocational courses next year. About 17 propose taking the Schoolmasters course and half a dozen the Medical.

Empire Native Policy.

UNIFORMITY IMPOSSIBLE AND UNDESIRABLE.

In this (Under Secretary to the Colonial Office) said, on a recent debate in the House of Commons, that the colored people of the Empire presented many variations of race and culture and no uniform policy in regard to them was possible or desirable.

With regard to a pre-arranged training for young African girls among some African tribes, any question of intermission, or any other difficulties, but the Colonial Secretary was exploring the matter further, and in the light of the information available, he hoped to take action which would satisfy the conscience of the House.

This was in reply to a motion by Mr. Mervyn (Mr. Parnell, N.) that the native population of the Dependencies should not be excluded as a source of low-grade labour; no governmental pressure should be used to provide wage-labour for employers; due care should be taken of native social well-being; the native demand for land should be adequately and satisfactorily met; and their rights should be properly safeguarded; when the native population is not yet fitted for self-government, policy should be fully maintained; and British and Dominion rights should be based upon the principle of equality for all without regard to race or colour.

A Room Let.

The main items on the agenda for this particular meeting was the discussion of a letter which had been written by Miss Buston, one of the members of the Association on the subject of the Lumbeva unrest.
