**BIG GAME HUNTERS' QUEER SPECIMEN.**

South African Students Enjoying Their Up-Country Trip.

**KITALE LADY'S NOVEL IDEAS ON RUGBY.**

["Standard" Special Correspondent.]

Eldoret, Tuesday. Kenya has been looked upon in the South as a game hole, a hotbed of malaria and other tropical fevers, but a striking disclaimer to these indications is afforded in the case of students of the South African Universities' students. They are fit as the proverbial fiddle, and if defeat should ever come their way it will not be because the men are out of condition. The landed and well-to-do business class of the health-giving rays of a Kenya sun. The fine condition of the players has been indicated by the success which has followed them on their up-country tour, now fast drawing to its close.

Days spent in the open, meaning the broad spaces of our country bearing its game and testing of the many forms of sport have all been conducive to bringing the men up to concert pitch. To-day they are in the pink, and will be in battle for his country's honour on the Rugby fields of East Africa!

**Many Friendships**

They are a wonderful set of sportsmen. Carefree and happy, they have made many true and deep-rooted friendships during their stay in the northern parts of the Colony. Picked and tested on every hand, they have been "licked" wherever they have visited, but the hero worship they have been subjected to has not spoilt them. They remain the good, modest sportsmen they were when first they landed on these sunny shores.

Nor has their success had any detrimental effects. It is the nature of being a missionary one, to help forward the code in a sister land, and has already allied to their own, sharing as it does in place, and no mean one, in the great African continent.

**Already We Learn!**

As the boys progress it becomes more and more evident that a fruitful harvest will be achieved from us. There was some indication that this in the course of the last match at Eldoret, when a com-

bined Plesau and Traze-Nana ends were defeated. The Kenya team's losses did make some endorsement to handle the ball, and, while no success from a scoring point of view, nevertheless, they gave the "Varsities" managed more than one anxious moment. The backs lay low after the spite of the students. There was not the usual straightness about it, and when they advanced they adopted a somewhat peculiar procedure of the visitors by coming forward in a fan formation.

But, while I see in this something of the nature of losses well learned, I do think that some little portion of the change is due to the advice given by Mr. J. G. Finlay in the course of his lecture. At Kitale he pointed out a few of the weaknesses and tendered some constructive criticism, and it is in this latter regard that the Kenya players have come to realize to the full the efficacy of the students' lecture.

Much more remains to be taken to heart, but, when the lesson has been presented the progress must be sure and continue.

**A Land of Promise**

Kenya's visitors are enjoying their stay in the fall. The more they see of the country the more they become enamoured of it. The Plesaus appeared to many of them because of the remarkable simplicity of it to the high valley lands of their own country. The agricultural possibilities of this part have been thoroughly grasped, and Kenya will find in these young Rugby missionaries public agents of the first rank when they return back to their own land.

**Naughty, Naughty, Peter!**

Why is it, I wonder, that people who frequent rugby matches with little knowledge of the game should so habitually express their views. Just what would have been "Gubbins'" feelings had he heard the lady who so strongly advocated a change in the rules to cope with his "tricks"? "Gubbins," in the match at Kitale, had the honour to hand the "dummy" in to a Kenya man. For Peter, had the lady had her way, he would have

been naturally punished. What punishment should have been his when he said the "dummy" minutes or two later the lady also says, but I find now it would have been from "What an unfair game this Rugby is! Why do the nice people of such 'trickery'?"

**Partaking of Pleasure.**

If there is one little medium of pleasure to be extracted from life the students have simply demonstrated their skill in finding and partaking of it. The "dummy" field the back should have to be treated in their own way, and they strive from start to finish to get the best of their own. On the whole, they are the same wonderful specimens as they are of old, they have been led in their progress of the sportsmanship of the Kenianians.

ensitive agreement before the opening of the conference. Disappointments in new talks that the conversations have resulted in little more than an exchange of views.

### Highpoint Propaganda

In the meantime certain Nationalist sentiments are endeavoring to raise the nation to the necessity of breaking up Japan's demand for a 75 per cent. loan, urging that a resolution should be passed through the Diet when it re-assembles on January 21. This would greatly embarrass the Government as the Opposition is likely to make political capital from it as the anticipated general election, since the Government would be bound to turn down such a resolution as it cannot afford thus to tie the hands of their delegates in London.

### GOVERNMENT'S POLICY.

It aims at the Naval Conference.

By the January 17. The express aim of the British Government in the latter part of the year was to achieve the maximum reduction in naval armaments commensurate with international security, avoiding proposals that would wreck the chances of agreement.

It is getting out on the heels of the conference the British Government therefore base itself on the assumption that for a considerable period peace is secured and that the more fact that a naval agreement is reached will increase the feeling of security.

Thus if the result of the conference does not fulfil all hopes of the British Government are determined to do everything within their power to show the world that it is prepared to proceed step by step to a satisfactory solution of the disarmament problem.

Everything is dependent on inter-national agreement. Britain will take on step towards disarmament solely as a partner. All that can be done in that way has been done. Britain can only move on the condition that other nations correspondingly and acceptably which comes out of the conference must really represent international policy.

An international agreement is expected this year and before the start of the conference (see page 10.)

Effect of Agreement. The cumulative effect of these agreements it is felt makes some advance in the direction of naval disarmament possible for in the view of the Government a military force must have some relation to

the immediate risk of war which as a result of these agreements has been reduced, and it is held inadvisable to maintain armaments beyond necessity.

In the opinion of the Government that the dangerous tendency would be to lead to a repeated world naval armament, unless checked, led to a competition. There are three ways in which the problem of naval reduction may be approached. Firstly, by the reduction of programmes of armaments in the future; secondly, by the reduction of programmes of armaments and thirdly, by an extension of the time of existing ships.

### Settlement and Outcome

In regard to treaties, the Washington Treaty last year, which is 20 years, if that time can be extended at the coming conference to 25 years the result will be equivalent to reduction.

As to curbing the problem is largely that of the distribution of tonnage within greater categories and of agreeing upon what should be an equitable as between nations and within the number of ships.

If without sacrificing security an agreement can be reached on these lines shipping competition, then the power and force of political agreements will be strengthened and the prospects of more complete disarmament when the time comes to revise the conference is improved.

reform which has passed to be healthy, sound financial position which we hope will permit the Administration at this time on to pass their profits to the Country in the shape of reduced rates. To us personally it is inconceivable that this Chamber, which has proved a satisfactory, should be changed. know that the 1929 crop was one in Kenya well in all probability, be an excellent one and that the estimated export surplus of the crop will all reach record levels, but we know equally well that in the past three had years (including 1928) have been, because which must first be paid off before the money surplus of the crop can be used for purchasing purposes or for any other use. 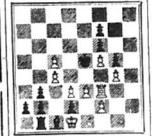

**The Poultry World**  
**FERTILITY OF EGGS.**  
Answers to Enquiries.

I have a number of queries on hand and so some of them are given my answers as they come. The poultry farmer writes that he is getting very bad average hatchings, a 150 egg incubator, a 150 egg incubator. He tells me fertility is averaging about 40 per cent, but the hatching is only averaging about 40 per cent. The incubator keeps steady at about 100 deg. and the moisture is supposed to be dry of the incubator, and by means of buckets of water standing full floor of the house. Every fertile egg is not necessarily followed that the incubation is at fault because a few chicks fail to get out.

However, a large proportion of failures, such as my correspondent has had, is almost certain to be some fault in incubation, and one must admit that an incubator will er more often than a hen.

This correspondent evidently realizes that the blame for small hatches generally lies with the incubator rather than with the incubator, and he explains his methods very fully. I mention this because many write to me for advice about hatching, and most of them explain that the fault remains be theirs as all their arrangements are perfect. All they want to know is what can be wrong with the eggs or machine, since in spite of their perfect management the results have been bad.
