**ELECTRIC POWER IN TANGANYIKA**

**A Zanzibar Company**

**WELCOME TO MR. JUSTICE JOHNSON.**

**License for Supply to Coastal Area.**

**EXCLUSIVE RIGHTS.**

The following notice in regard to the utilization of the power of the Pangani Falls for the provision of light and power in the coastal area of Tanganyika Territory, was recently issued by the Government at Dar-es-Salaam, under the "Tanganyika Standard" (—)

"With reference to the notice on this subject which appeared in the Press at the end of November, 1919, it is hereby notified for general information that as the Company have withdrawn, the Power Securities Corporation, the other firm which submitted a tender, has been informed that Government is willing to negotiate a license with the Corporation on the terms generally of their tender. Exclusive rights have been offered to this Corporation in respect of areas within a 60 miles radius of the Pangani Falls and Tanga Town respectively.

It will be remembered that the statement to the Press referred to dealt with the commission for the development of electric power of the Pangani Falls and was as follows: "Two tenders were received in reply to the advertisement of November 8, 1917 inviting tenders, and the African General Development Co. has been informed that Government is willing to negotiate a license with the Corporation on the terms generally of their tender. The rates for light and power noted in the two tenders were identical.

He thought the Acting Attorney-General for the welfare of the island to him and recalled the fact that he had watched the legal address of Mr. Knight-Bruce and the Acting Resident Magistrate in Mombasa. He also desired to thank Mr. Wiggin and the members of the Bar for whom he speaks for their words of encouragement. He hoped that the years to be spent in Zanzibar by him would be both happy and of the business of the Court was then taken up.

Mr. Clarke said it would be hard to dispute the statement made by Mr. O'Brien. He had endeavored to represent the commercial point of view as far as he could and if the commercial community had no expression to his point of view he could not very well represent such views.

All questions of the details in addition to the resolutions already published the following resolutions were also passed:

(1) That Mr. Wood proposed and Mr. O'Brien seconded: "That a copy of the memorandum dated December 28, 1930 prepared by the President which is fully explanatory be forwarded to all constituent chambers and the support of the same be sought in obtaining for it the widest possible publicity."

(2) That it be an instruction to the Executive to ascertain what any developments in the organization are necessary to meet not only more general use of the Association by the Government of the three Territories but that the said Government may be afforded an equal and effective means of obtaining quick decisions where necessary that the Executive prepare a memo with recommendations to be submitted to all Chambers. That if the same and recommendations are approved by the Chambers, that if the matter be communicated to the Government for their consideration the question be referred to next session of the Association.

Mr. J. H. Carey (Mombasa) declined to vote on the first resolution as he had no opinion of the communication was a reflection on the activities.

The President emphatically denied the pointing out that such a thought was far from his mind when he prepared the memorandum.

**Kenya Crop Report.**

**BUREAUX AVAILABLE FOR EXPORT.**

The Department of Agriculture crop report for the month of December has been published. The estimated surplus of maize available for export, of about 1,200,000 bags is expected to be realized.

What is now expected to be raised from 80,000 bags to 70,000 bags as disease continues to be restricted.

In regard to barley it is believed that about 40,000 tons will be available instead of 25,000 as previously estimated.

Coffee is not expected to realize the previous estimate of 10,000 tons, a figure between 8,000 to 9,700 tons will be nearer the actual amount available for export.

The figure for sisal, 30,000 tons remains unchanged.

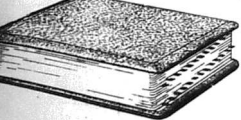

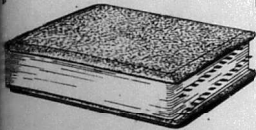

Mr. Mackendall continued his further observations to these heads. First, to emphasize the fact that the British Empire, which would not maintain the very population there. Some required reasons to the whole world without limitation. There ordinary legitimate limitation. The British Government's problem was to satisfy the will to live which lay at the foundation of the British naval tradition. The world would be open to Britain for food and life.

Emphasizing the peculiar status of the British Commonwealth he added that British naval strength was required "to maintain our own family in a happy inter-relationship with the Motherland."

**"Protection of Trade Routes"**  
Secondly, Mr. Mackendall laid stress on the fact that British naval strength was, and must necessarily be dispersed in every sea. They must be divided into three groups, at the very least with serious consequences for light and heavy purposes. But for police and peace purposes. The latter could not be kept concentrated. It must be on the Pacific and on the Atlantic. Not, he repeated, for war purposes but for peace and ordinary commercial purposes.

**British Psychology**  
Thirdly, he emphasized the importance of the problem from the view point of British psychology. The sea was everything to this country. "If we were taken on the sea we were blocked everywhere," he said. "We had no back-up on the land, no railway communication, no perfect air perfect by which we could draw our supplies." That was why all thoughtless loans concentrated on the sea. "We have felt, he added that to the sea we had to defend our routes against everybody and against every form of aggression, against every aspect of sea weakness. "He would like this to be changed."

which will not be blocked, will not be occupied by hostile fleets which we are unable to meet. We want a sense of security of the sea, a change to stability, which has influenced British policy."

**Position of Italy**  
Signor Grandi said that Italy was practically at a standstill was said and dispensed on her maritime communications. He mentioned the fact of securing over three quarters of the world's commerce essential to the life and sea population. Also for Italy the sea was her life and Italy was never a country with world wide maritime communications. Italy's best communications had to cross the barrier of the Alps and her maritime communications for through routes were thousands of miles from her ports. This was a serious position regarding Italy's relative superiority of naval strength. In any case she could not be asked to keep naval armaments at least on a level with those of any other continental European power.

He hoped that the principle of one power's standard might be applied at the lowest possible level by Italy in her relation to continental European countries. Italy was ready to reduce her armaments to a level not higher than any providing it would not be considered by any other European power.

**Japan's Hope.**  
Mr. Wakabayashi said the fact that the Washington agreement, though the fulfilled desire by all the signatory powers, it must evidently serve to unite all powers in the common hope and endeavour now to further and supplement the good work accomplished at Washington, complementarity with the progress of the general situation.

**New Zealand.**  
Mr. Wilson of New Zealand stated that New Zealand supported a small naval fleet of the British Empire. Its cost of naval defence was about £200,000, the population 1,500,000 and the volume of the trade £100,000,000. "It is an island country like New Zealand, separated from the continent by a wide expanse of sea, its trade makes most necessary life or death."

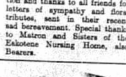

### Indians in East Africa.

Lord Francis Burt, in a letter addressed to us and published elsewhere today, says a pertinent question which, in the light of recent political events in India and the attitude of Indians in East Africa towards their political aspirations in these Territories, must have occurred very soon to many thoughtful people. The Indian National Congress, sitting at Lucknow at the end of the year, passed a resolution demanding the complete independence of India within a definite period, and inviting participation in the proposed Round Table Conference in London. Instructing a horde of the legislative bodies and authorizing the Central Committee to proceed with a campaign of active agitation should it be considered that

action necessary. In a speech which will be reported by all the friends of India, the President of the Congress, Pandit Jawaharlal Nehru, defined independence as follows: "Independence for us means complete freedom from British rule, and the complete British Imperialism. Having obtained our freedom, India would welcome all attempts at good co-operation and would even agree to give up part of her own independence for the sake of the larger group of which she is an equal member. The British Empire, such as it is, can and cannot be a true Commonwealth so long as Imperialism is its basis and its spirit. It is, in other words, her chief means of advancement. It shall be our aim to do away with it. To-day or to-morrow we may not be strong enough to assert our will; but let us do so, and we shall be strong and free. This is a socialistic ideal, not a belief in Kings or princes or the order of society which produces the modern kind of industry."

Having admitted that violence was a necessary part of the independence struggle, the Congress then said: "If this Congress, the Indian nation, comes to the use of force, it will be to rid us of our slavery, not to subjugate others." Finally, it adopted as one of its "policy" the use of force by the Indian nation, if necessary, to secure its independence.
