FUTURE OF CONVENTION OF ASSOCIATIONS.

Strong Criticism by Up-Country Bodies.

IS EXECUTIVE SECRETIVE?

Enquiry into Constitution to Secure Better Representation.

A long discussion took place in the Convention of Associations yesterday on the future constitution of that body. This has followed success of a number of up-country associations and the refusal or inability of some new associations to join.

The original motion was that no change should be made and the amendment that in view of the financial position of the Convention and the fact that it had ceased to be representative, some form of drastic reorganization was imperative and such reorganization should be carried out forthwith.

After a very long discussion during which some very candid views were expressed especially by representatives of District Associations, the meeting compromised in passing a resolution to the effect that the Convention was an essential body and no part of its activities should be curtailed but the Executive is directed to explore the whole question of the constitution with a view to assisting District Associations both financially and in regard to better representation.

Details which will be considered will include the circulation of reports regarding the activities of the Executive, the system of voting, the basis of contributions to affiliated associations, and what form the assistance can be given to them in connection with the attendance of

CONTINUATION REGARDED AS ESSENTIAL.

The Convention of Associations yesterday discussed their and some outspoken views were given. The question was expressed, that the position of certain Associations from the Convention and the unwillingness of some Associations to join was largely due to financial reasons although the Executive session in no advancing condition associations more fully of their proceedings.

Photographic Society.

DISCUSSION ON CINEMA FILMS.

At the meeting of the Photographic Society of Kenya held on Monday last, Mr. Noble pointed out some interesting comparisons in colour rendering with the "Cine-Kodak." Four shots of a flower study were prepared, one taken with ordinary film, another with a 2 1/2 inch lens, a third a third version of the same subject on panchromatic film, and finally a combination of panchromatic film and a colour filter. A progressive gain in clarity and tonal rendering was apparent in the pictures. A child portrait and a landscape were similarly treated, the latter in particular illustrating the superiority of panchromatic film for bringing out complexion.

When using the filter, the lecturer had increased his exposure four times with the ordinary film and twice with the panchromatic, but since the film showed signs of under exposure, a still greater increase was recommended (e.g. all and so).

A further length of film demonstrated the use of lenses of different focal lengths. Wide-berths and telephoto lenses were photographed with inch, 2 inch, and 3 inch lenses. The results, though some distance away from the camera, were reproduced on slides, a large scale with the 2 inch lens, and, to a lesser degree, with the 3 inch lens. Owing to a strong wind prevailing at the time, the films were somewhat marred by camera vibration, thus emphasizing the need for a rigid tripod in telephoto work.


