columns of the "Standard" but attached very little importance to them in view of the majority being assigned, and there being no indication whether the complaints and some from previous business. He pointed out that in England, with the vast amount of money at their disposal and with the funds of the bank available, the British Broadcasting Company was obliged to submit a financial statement. The local station anxious to improve their programme and to have better results every year possible will gladly submit to all constructive criticism. But he added that nearly every criticism which had been published had been purely destructive. There are certain difficulties with which the local Company has to contend, but he is personally unacquainted with the results of the financial statement to the satisfaction of the programme, and as regards the new features, primarily, it must be realized that the Company obtains its revenue from the Kenya radio service cost more than four times the amount which was received from licence-fee and even so it is one of the most successful radio services in the world. "If everyone paid their share," said Mr. Venn, "we would be in a position to improve our programmes considerably." He estimated that the licence-fee was too high and said every levator would be made to reduce it. A very great deal of progress, but the law, in the present form, is cumbersome and it is extremely difficult to find one who is receiving the service without contributing towards its cost. It is hoped that this difficulty may be overcome in the future.

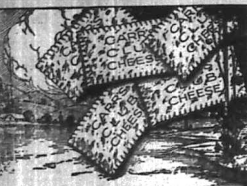

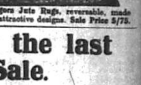

The New Year fixtures in all instances took place in the first week of the season, while the battle of the leagues remains as strong as ever. Those smaller clubs which are identified with the Cup tournament in this competition is so widely necessary, their trials and troubles begin and end with every season. The larger clubs may be known their serious financial position, but to the smaller fry it is a case of life or the pore, their troubles are always with us.

With a heavy programme to be gone through next year, the Cup-ties are not always the pleasing they appear to be at first. There is money in the Cup, undeniably, but the fact remains that it is a mixed blessing. To those teams beset with serious financial matters, the coming of the Cup-ties spells the silver alibi in the many dark rainy afternoons may be replenished, and money enough made to carry the club through to the next season. But there are clubs who are not so dependent on the gift from the Cup, and to them the line may be the means of effectually settling proposals of the league-championship.

The testing nature of the football played in the Cup is generally attended with injury list, and, again, the fact that money had to be made up on the league battle imposes additional hardship, with the net result that the second part of the season becomes a real test for all clubs.

It comes as a breath of relief, therefore, when the situation of the clubs can be directed wholly on the field for points, and the worries of the Cup-ties forgotten in the midst of other matters. To-morrow there is a cooling breeze in the football world. The cup is forgotten for the time being and

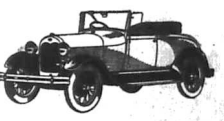

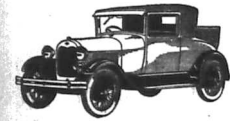
