EDITOR'S NOTE.

This week's page will be devoted entirely to House. Canon Rogers' article on the planting of rose trees will be very helpful to any one who means to put in some roses during the coming rain. Many of you will remember Canon Rogers' rooms at our Flower Shows, he has carried out the McMillan Plan for the best six varieties of roses ever seen in the country. Readers will remember Mr. Gall's article on the propagation of roses which appeared in this page some months ago. I recommended gardeners then to cut the article out and keep until they would be planting their roses again, so that they should have it at hand to refer to. March is the month for planting roses in the districts which require their rains to begin at the end of the month.

ROSES IN KENT.

In the first place, I must claim any particular qualifications for writing about the roses, including the preparation of the soil. I suppose that I had better begin with that. Now all authorities on the subject will tell you that the ground available should be a liberal amount of well decayed manure incorporated with the soil. I do not doubt that this is such the best way for people who have the time and the well-decayed manure available, but most of us are not in this happy position and I have tried to carry out such work as well as I can on my own soil. I will explain what I do, because I believe that anyone can do the work and the result is quite satisfactory.

First of all I get my gardeners to dig a hole about three feet deep and the same in diameter. Into this I have placed a good supply of manure from the cattle yard. I leave this to decay and add time to time wood ash, old bones and dead flowers and any such rubbish from the garden, filling in soil from time to time. The last lot of it is the soil which was taken from the hole without any admixture. This is well mixed with the manure, rotted with the manure. Old bones are particularly valuable as they supply the phosphorus in which most Kenya soils are deficient. In line and phosphorus.

In planting roses it is necessary to spread out the goods well, and arrange for them to be well so as to arrive just before the rains, so as to give them a start. It should be understood that plants can only be deposited from England during the winter season and that it is better to get them in early, but not later than the end of February.

QUEENS AND ANSWERS.

A. I. from Eldoret, writes that she is not at all pleased with some rose trees that she has planted. This is a very different letter to answer with the following remarks and help:-

The stock upon which the roses are budded will not affect the color, shape or size. The color is usually very much affected by wet weather and when trees are suffering from drought or poor growth. Unless a rose gets away well the first season it is likely to be disappointing and roses in the country must always have a large quantity of water. The blooms in the nursery world of a transplant are never good in form, size or color, and good blooms can only be looked

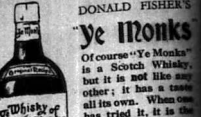
for on the new growth springing from the rose above the bud. Any soot below the bud and from the bottom and if they flower they will be very different in color. The foliage of a sucker is quite different, of course, and such growth should be cut away at once.

In almost all descriptions of roses with any orange shades we have the orange and yellow shades are to my mind usually the most disappointing. In hot weather and dry localities the yellow and yellow shades of roses I have seen planted through the country, some being at 7,000 or 8,000 feet have often been better irrespective of soil and the roses are broken up and in consequence.

Some soils either from the proximity of trees or because they are naturally acid will not grow roses satisfactorily. One has to look round for another situation. It is quite possible that the rose may season all the year long in position will put out more growth and if that growth is set up they will carry flowers which are not likely to be disappointing in color or other qualities.

In addition to the above remarks I am told that one should make a rose tree more or less in order to get the tree rooted. If one is told that one should be careful to plant at the base of the hill. In this way the soil is more readily available and roots and presumably also to the strength of the rose tree.

ADVICE TO KENYA MAIZE FARMERS

Plant Breeder on the Industry.

Mr. G. L. Burton, the Government Plant Breeder, has written an article entitled "Advice to Maize Growers." This article deals with the factors governing the selection of the variety generally and contains advice on the value of experiments of the variety Plant Breeding Station. The concluding portion of the article which appears below deals with the methods of planting.

Below is given the number of plants per acre which these should grow, when maize is planted at certain spacings.

- Rows 40" apart and plants spaced at 16" in the row, No. of plants per acre: 7,500.

low farmers would be dissatisfied with on their own farms.

It is suggested that even a stand of 9 bags to the acre would give a yield of 13 bags to the acre if the soil is good. Both yields are low because that part of the yield is too small. The rainfall was very inadequate. The yield of the best stand here was 44 per cent higher than that of the mean per acre. The plan is more plainly still, a similar regard to the acre, only give 12 bags to the acre, an acre which, the same as a gross return to the farm, means an acre as opposed to the 96/ per acre of the 12 bags to the acre. The price (viz. 5/6) on the farm of the 96/ per acre and the price of the 12 bags to the acre is 5/6. The farmer shows a good profit, the latter hardly more than pays expenses. In this connection it should be understood that what is normally called a ragged stand would probably not have yielded more than 6 1/2 bags to the acre in the above experiment. Thinning out was so done in this experiment that the same number of plants was left in each 1/2 of an acre, i.e. just over 5,000 on the acre.

The experiment to discover the difference in yield between an even stand and a ragged stand was not done on an acre. This square, which was not possible, would have yielded a large gain, which it was not possible to estimate. The experiment was sufficiently accurate however, to show what a great difference is found there between an even and a ragged stand.

It is hoped that it has been made quite clear now that an even stand is extremely important and no reasonable expense should be spared to obtain it. After all it is high yield per acre that matters particularly in a low priced crop, and not a low average yield over a large area. Before discussing methods of obtaining an even stand it must be clearly stated that it is an impossibility unless sufficient preparation and labour are put into the work. From the point of view of making a ragged stand, the farmer will make most as such as under the capacity of the staff available.

Even stands can be obtained either by grading seed and using a planter or by planting by hand.

The Planter Method.

The planter must not travel over the land at a greater pace than the maker intended. It is essential that the seed be graded through sieves in such a way that the even seed would pass through a mesh not more than

1/1000 of an inch smaller than the mesh the largest seed would pass through. The size of the holes in the mesh of the planter must near the proper relation to the size of the largest of the seeds. If grading of seed is done it is possible to plant more evenly and to whatever spacing is preferred by the individual farmer.

If grading is not done seed must be dropped twice as often in the row as is finally required and the plants thinned out. This procedure is not so satisfactory as it may seem as it is so impracticable as most native labourers are unable to do it accurately and large gaps occur between the plants. The method therefore suggested that another method of sowing good stands is to plant thickly and then remove a number of plants out.

This method has the advantage that it minimizes the depredations of cutworms in cases where the worms do not eat out whole rows completely. In preparation to get some spacing it will be necessary eventually to do some thinning out by hand and the difficulty already discussed crops up.

It is to be observed that the difficulty is to plant in hills because farmers will thin out hills properly although they do not seem able to do so otherwise. It is possible to train them in this out row.

Planting in Hills.

There are difficulties in using close row planters in this Colony as well as in dropping seeds in hills by means of ordinary planters. It is strongly recommended that planting in hills by hand is the best and most satisfactory method of obtaining accurate stands. Whichever of the two methods is used, the hills should be spaced in such a way that the hills thinned out in one plant. This is not, however, the most economical or quickest way of using hand labour because the work has to be done in rows at frequent intervals. If two or three plants are left in hills spaced more widely apart, planting would be a saving of 44" apart by 15" in the hills could be left away 30" or 45" leaving 2 and 3 plants respectively.

The first is not recommended because the spacing is too small to allow of thinning and so many large that the amount of hand-labour required would be enormous. The second is not recommended because it is probable that with three plants in hills widely spaced, the best way is not being made of the space available.

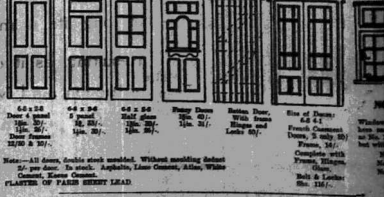

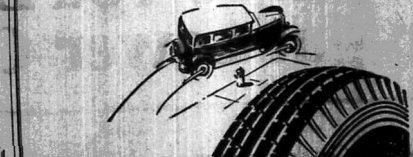

Mr. J. A. H. Cotton makes the sensational disclosure in the "Evening Standard" that a scheme has been projected to form a new league comprising the leading Association professional clubs in the south of England.

The proposed new organization would include teams at present in membership with the Football League, and would mean a clean North-South cleavage of that body.

Disintegration of Southern clubs with Northern dominance in League affairs is, Mr. Cotton states, the inspiration behind the move. London, of course, would be the nerve centre of such a new body.

Mr. Cotton thinks the impulse to form an independent league of the above, is the sequel to the connection by the F. A. of eight sides to the League. It is claimed by designers of such a league that it would be much more compact than the competition of the present League permits, and that it would be an interesting and strenuous.

THE JOINT EAST AFRICAN BOARD.
Last Month's Executive Council Topics.
CONGO TREATY.

[STANDARD] CORRESPONDENT.
 London, February 13.
 Sir John Sandeman Allen, M.P., in the absence of Sir Sydney Hogg, presided over the meeting of the Executive Council of the Joint East African Board which was held on February 9, at Westminster House. Various subjects were discussed, but the main feature therein nearly all affected the subjects which the Board is to lay before a Conference at the Colonial Office either towards the end of the month or the beginning of March. These embrace almost all the topics which have been before the Board in the last few months. They include the question of Congo Basin Treaties, the suggested removal of the Director of Agriculture from Kampala to Entebbe, the position and activities of the Amasi Institute, and a variety of other matters of a similar nature.

There was most general discussion on the Congo Basin Treaties and it was ultimately decided to appoint a committee consisting of Sir John Sandeman Allen (Chairman), Mr. Hattersley, Mr. C. P. Fennelly, and Major Trevylyan, to meet sub-committees appointed by the East and West African sections of the London Chamber of Commerce to consider if some agreement views could be reached. The composition of the Board's committee was definitely composed of people holding different views so that everybody would be represented. The Chairman pointed out that it was far better to lay the views of those concerned before the Colonial Office even if they did not agree. The note was taken of the views of Kenya settlers first reported in the "East African Standard" and of the Association of Chambers of Commerce of East Africa as detailed in a recent telegram to the "Times." All three seemed to favour a continuation of the present system, with possibly some alteration of boundaries.

A New Road.
 A letter dated January 24 from the Colonial Office was read to the Council stating that the Government of Tanganyika had reported that a sum of £1,700 had been awarded in the Direct Public Works estimates for 1930/31 for the construction of a road 34 miles in length to connect Sikuyu with Sakaia, and that on the completion of the road there would be

possible communication in the dry weather between Dar-es-Salaam and Tanganyika and thence to Mombasa.

A letter dated 3rd February 1930 from Mr. Wigglesworth was read reminding the Council that in March 1927, a memorandum was issued by the Board on the question of the future control of Assani Institute. A constructive suggestion had been put forward in that document that the prevailing body for the Institute should be set up in London composed of officials, business and scientific interests, which would operate with assistance from a Advisory Committee in East Africa consisting of the various Agricultural Officers. Mr. Wigglesworth pointed out that although this proposal had been placed before the Colonial Office by the Board at Conference in 1927 and 1928 no action had been taken, and that the First Report of the work of the Institute, which had just been issued, indicated no contact between the Departments of Agriculture and the Director of the Institute.

The attention of the Council was drawn to a proposition that had been put forward by the Coffee Planters' Union of Kenya and East Africa towards establishment of a research station and service for the Coffee Industry. This proposition had been endorsed by the Agricultural Commission which had just sat under Sir Daniel Hall. The proposal was that the Institute should bear a large proportion of the cost of such research, but the Members of the Council considered that investigation should be made to decide whether research at Assani would not be equally beneficial to coffee planters in Kenya and save considerable expense. The Chairman supported this view and it was agreed to request the Colonial Office of the Board's views on this matter which members considered called for attention.

There was also some discussion regarding Kenya Port and the attitude of the Tanganyika Government in refusing from laying out the site until the completion of the road now being built by the Uganda Government. It was pointed out that this was very detrimental to business and the view was expressed that useful recommendations might be made to the Colonial Office in favour of the administration by Uganda of the small strip of Tanganyika Territory on the north side of the river.

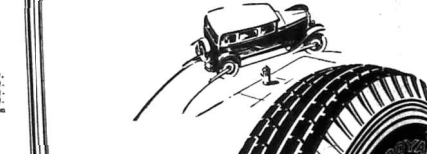

RETIREMENTS ON THE SOLE WORKER LIST.

Many of the special loan works which have been in the hands of the I.W.O. for some years are now nearing completion and in place a new programme of further work is authorized.

Already a few European and Asiatic are under notice, and "Standard" representatives who called on the Acting Director of Public Works Mr. Lynde yesterday, are informed that it is most probable further and increasing work will take place during the next few months.

PROBLEMS OF THE FARMER

Value of Co-operative Efforts in Bad Years.

SOME COMPARISONS.

"**HARVEST**" CORRESPONDENT.
Nairobi, March 4.
ALTHOUGH the present marketing season, as a general one, the position of the farmer is no better and in some cases, certainly worse than it was this time last year. This is going to have reflection on the commercial farmer generally, and it is apparent as well as this that the majority of farmers who have had less years recently will have to be satisfied for a further period of 12 months.

It is estimated that the exportable surplus of maize will be 1,200,000 bags or 150,000 tons, but this heavy crop that in some cases has been produced at a loss, and those who were in for larger acreages on the hope of recuperating from previous bad years, may find themselves worse off than before. The present price, although not low since the war, has set the highest bid for minimum prices paid during the five years preceding the war, and if the world's price starts to prevail above them we may expect a further fall in the price of maize.

HOW THE NIGHT HAVES PASSED!

WANDERERS' CONQUEST. (By Mail.)
In what quartering football associations are meeting football teams played throughout the League Championship. Today they met at the bottom of the Third Division table, with relegation staring them in the face, possessing a meagre total of 50 points which, on the second Saturday in February, Sheffield Wednesday doubled its meagre effort to retain the championship. Newcastle have fallen from their high estate, whereas the Wanderers, piling from strength to strength, are proving a team of a calibre only to that which made Huddersfield Town's post-war championship for successive years. The Sheffielders, with the aid of a 4-1 victory over Burnley, raised themselves over and shoulders from the rank one on their title and the other on the all-time Cup, determined not to do as others have done before, and fall between the two blocks which stand so tentatively firm. Newcastle's Sheffield's other club, Huddersfield, were proceeding to a 3-3 victory on Newcastle's ground, assisted chiefly by their shooting Davies, who scored three times.

A Slip.
And what of the other successful teams who seek to dampen Wednesday's hopes? Manchester City who had the lead until the end of October, have suffered a setback and sustained their third successive defeat when Manchester United paid them a visit and scored the only goal of a somewhat disappointing game. Derby County should have profited by this result to gain second place, but they had to visit Portsmouth, and the Hampshire men, eager to place another step between themselves and relegation, were in no secondarily-defeating. They gained two goals in the first half and were quite equal to the task of recording their opponents after the interval, when such a score occurred. Leeds United had no such reason to fight hard when they entertained Huddersfield, who the New

Not even have Huddersfield, now an Arsenal man, could have saved Sunderland from Leeds, however, for the home forwards could have guessed that five goals had they not desired, and Sunderland never failed to score.

Spirited Forward Display.

Aston Villa and Blackburn Rovers who were shortly to do battle in the Cup tournament, both displays which showed the possession of tip-top form. Villa would have scored had they had a forward in any case, had not in part to an injury which caused Snelton, the Wanderers' centre-half, to be off the field for twenty minutes. Blackburn Rovers gave such a spirited forward display that their victory over Huddersfield Town was not surprising, although much credit must be given to Gantley, a new and young winger who scored three times, and has now scored ten goals for the Rovers in seven matches. Gloucester City occupied a quite unusual position in sharing two goals with Liverpool on Wednesday's ground, but would have done even better with more accurate shooting; while Middleborough, although lacking the services of some of their best men, including Carrall, gained a very easy victory over Birmingham by five goals to one. London's two First Division teams both won well, but against clubs who could not be expected to make much resistance. Arsenal entertained Grimsby Town, who were without one of their finest forwards, Robson, and were beaten by two clear goals, while Arsenal delighted their own supporters with a 4-0 victory over Everton with the aid of Lambour, the Highbury club's centre-forward, who scored three times, and scored very definitely that Huddersley is superior in the Gunners' back.

No Lack of Thrills.

There is no lack of thrills in Second Division football. With Oldham Athletic, Blackpool and Chelsea at it hammer and tongs in the effort to gain promotion, the one which mattered early on no man can say how the struggle will end, but it must be said that, on the day under notice, Chelsea gave the best display in beating West Bromwich Albion by two clear goals. The other clubs mentioned were rather lucky to emerge winners from less than snappy matches, for Oldham Athletic could not be said to have shown superiority over Southampton, yet won 2-0

points by the odd goal of five, thanks to a free kick about ten minutes from the end; and Burnley were sent off their way to a draw at Blackpool, where the home men were thereby fortunate to win by two goals to one. They were nearly off at one time to be the best team, but a throw-in, showed something like their best form in beating Bradford by five goals to one, and Swansea Town and Wolverhampton Wanderers also gained home victories, though by a single goal in each case, over Cardiff City and Bristol City respectively. Cardiff City were easily enough against Reading by a goal to one, but they were Forest could only share the points from a goalless draw with Tottenham Hotspur, and 1-1 drew recorded.

There seems every prospect of a London club being fortunate enough to gain promotion from the Third Division, for Tottenham are drawing away from their rivals in the Southern League, a comfortable 5-0 win over Watford increasing their lead to four points from Plymouth Argyle, who could only draw with Gillingham, one of the most unimportant clubs in the Section. Brighton and Hove Albion had some good Cup shooting practice at the expense of Torquay United, and Clapton Orient and Fulham continued on the winning side, but Queen's Park Rangers and Crystal Palace were beaten.

Port Vale, with an away victory over Milton by three goals to two, drew further ahead from Stockport County in the Northern League, and Bangor retained a lead of two points in the Scottish League by beating Elginmouth by four clear goals. Aberdeen winning on Moray's ground by the odd point of three.

Amateur National.

The Amateur International match between Scotland and Wales, played at Hampden Park, Glasgow, was not a very inspiring affair, although Scotland deserved their victory by a single goal. The forwards on both sides were slow to take their chances, but it was Clapham Queen's Park who scored the goal which mattered early in the second half, gave a good account of himself at centre-forward in the winning side, and the most of the match from the Welsh point of view was Len Davies (Cardiff City)—and the Cardiff forward of the same name—who was not without a number of fine goals and undoubtedly saved his side from a heavier defeat.
