## BRIGHTER OUTLOOK AT NAVAL CONFERENCE.

Agreement Between Japan and America.

## AN IMPORTANT ACHIEVEMENT.

British and U.S.A. Differences Entirely Settled.

There is a much brighter outlook in Naval Conference circles as a result of negotiations held over week-end. A number of formidable obstacles have been reduced or entirely negotiated.

It is stated that the slight differences existing between Great Britain and the United States of America have now been entirely removed and both countries are now in 100 per cent. agreement.

This development indicates that America and Japan have come to terms in regard to the latter's claim in 70 per cent. of the former's tonnage.

The difficult situation between France and Italy has been cast as a result of further private discussions and efforts were being made to find a middle ground between the demands of these two powers.

It is stated that the present position of the Conference is that, if agreed, Britain, America and Japan will now arrive at a three-power agreement.

## ITALY'S DEMAND FOR PARITY.

## CARE OF THE CAR.

## Protecting the Chassis in Bad Weather.

## RAINING THE OWNER DRIVERS TASK.

During the winter months, when the roads are often wet, and there are many points of water on the roads, it is difficult to drive a car in safety. The springs and their shackles are used up to work in a continuous bath of water. In some of which must inevitably find a way through the chassis between the spring leaves, here is shown as an alternative and cause wear.

There are also many other parts where similar ill-effects may develop, such as when in all sorts of weather. For example, the various pin joints of the brake system, the ball joints of the steering connections, the bearings, the bushes, the bolts and so on. To safeguard all these parts but nevertheless important chassis components, it is necessary to use very frequently, if not every day, a layer of grease or oil over the road to find an entry. Unfortunately, the chassis of a motor car is not made of steel, but of light alloys, some of which are very small, such as the pin joints of the gears.

## Valuable Joint and Spring Protection.

To the more important points, for example, the ball joints of the steering system, the bushes, etc. Some form of cover as part of the standard equipment, and these are usually supplied by the makers to exclude dirt and retain the lubricant. Similarly, many manufacturers of chassis makers for the springs are provided with covers, which are better than those which have no spring or various chassis bearing supports.




