GOVERNMENT SAVED BY THE LIBERALS.

Conservative Motion of Censure Defeated.

THE TARIFFS QUESTION.

Mr. Baldwin Condemns Labour's Fiscal Policy.

A Conservative motion of censure on the Government was moved in the House of Commons on Wednesday by Mr. Stanley Baldwin. The motion was defeated by the Liberals voting against the motion.

The terms of the motion as moved by Mr. Baldwin were that the Government had failed to take any steps to reduce the rate of taxation and to increase in efficiency. The policy of Government was blamed for this state of affairs, in the refusal to extend safeguarding of industries, and Imperial Preference, and also the failure to declare its intention in regard to existing McKenna duties.

Mr. Baldwin stated during his speech that unless the Government could do more in the way of economic co-operation with a view to economic unity of the Empire, there was a real risk that the threads that bound the Empire, which were already growing, might break.

CARE OF THE CAR.

Protecting the Chassis in Bad Weather.

HAZARD THE OWNER'S DRIVING TALE.

During the winter months, when the roads are often wet and muddy for days and there are many points of the chassis which are fairly obvious, for example, that the springs and their shackles are soaked up to work in a continuous bath of water and get some of the mud most tenaciously fast to the spring leaves, there is a way into the chassis bearings or between the spring leaves, there to act as an abrasive and cause

There are also many other points where similar ill-effects may develop in the winter, and need to be all sorts of weather; for example, the various pin joints of the brake-operating gear, the ball joints of the steering mechanism, the bearings of the axle, the various joints of the chassis, the grease gun must be used very frequently, for if they are kept full of grease it will be the more difficult for water or mud to find an entry. Unfortunately, it is by no means easy to keep grease in all these bearings, some of which are quite small, such as the pin joints of the brake gear.

Valuable Joint and Spring Protection.

To the more important points—for example, the ball joints of the steering rod—many manufacturers fit some form of cover as part of the standard equipment, and these serve a twofold purpose, for they exclude dirt and retain the lubricant in and around the joint itself. Similarly, many manufacturers also provide covers for the springs and their shackles, for the springs are certainly not for use in wet weather, and it is not surprising that these which have to operate in such conditions are bound to be doing so with only minimum

wear at all these points, but he will save himself a considerable amount of time and trouble. Very best treated rubber protection, known as the Durom treatment, can be fitted very easily to the various points and bearings. They are made of a special grease and are fitted like a special rubber, and when they get greasy, therefore, is retained in and around the joint, and prevents the entry of mud and water.

These special covers have now been adapted to protect most of the vital points of the car. They can be fitted for example, to spring shackles, steering connections, to the various points of the brake gear, to universal joints, and to brake cables. Other covers are made to fit round the base of gear and brake levers, so as to exclude draught, and covers are also made to fit over a sparking plug to protect them against water which may find its way through the tapers of the bonnet of the car, or to be left standing in a downpour of rain.

Spring Leaf Lubrication.

As regards the lubrication of gears not so fitted as standard they may be obtained from a number of manufacturers. Before fitting grease the springs should, of course, be properly cleaned and lubricated. A useful small set for introducing lubricant between the leaves of the springs is the very best of the modern type, and is known as the "Leaves Apart and Always Grease" brand. It is made of a special material to one of the wedges of the small roller, the latter introduced in some cases, in order to slip under the small retaining clips used to secure the springs in order to leave the leaves to separate. Incidentally, it may be mentioned here that not only are annoying squeaks of resistance between the springs will prevent that the riding comfort is also improved. There are other ways in which the car can be protected in bad weather, and the use of a radiator shell is by no means to be recommended. It is well to remember that a shell in cases where a car has to be left standing in the open will be warmed up after every stop. It should not be forgotten that every time a cold engine has to be warmed up it is inferior to some slight extent from under-lubrication for a short period, and, in fact, it becomes warmer than the oil in the cylinder, and so all the bearings and for the motor.

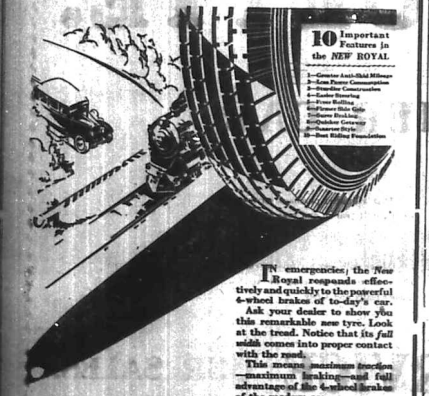

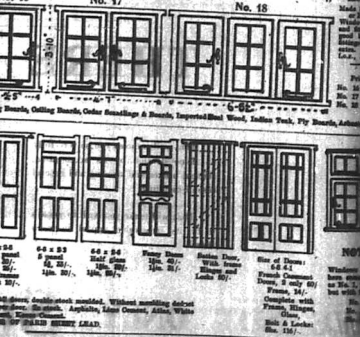

The Government's Committee believe that the tunnel would be built, maintained and operated by private enterprise at a most efficient cost, although it being conveyed at a rate higher than those at present in force on the short sea-routes.

Ministry Report.
 Lord Bishopp says the report is subject to a number of questions, the general conclusion of which is that even if the tunnel could be built, maintained and operated by private enterprise it would be a very costly and a very busy traffic at competitive rates. The committee therefore is certain and at least so slight in the evidence submitted has shown for instance a definite detriment to established industries, such for instance as shipping and agriculture—British Official Wireless Service.

TANZANIA CROPS.

Prospects on the Whole Good

DAMAGE BY FLOODS.

With the exception of a few areas in the north-east and flooding have had deleterious results. Tanzania's agricultural prospects, as shown in the February issue report of the Department of Agriculture, are distinctly optimistic. Crops reported to have been given below in full—
