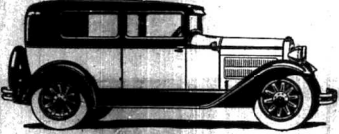

S. A. STUDENTS' RUGBY TOUR.

Financial Position in Detail.

HONORARY TREASURER'S STATEMENT.

Yesterday extracts from the Hon. Treasurer's report, which was submitted and approved at the annual general meeting of the Rugby Union of Kenya in the New Stanley Hotel on February 26th, were published. Below is appended the full report given by Mr. Worrell.

The accounts, closed and audited, cover the period from January 1, 1929, to March 12, 1930.

It was not considered feasible to close the accounts on Dec. 31, 1929 owing to the visit of the South African Students and the consequent large amount of money to be received and disbursed during the first two months of the year. I understand that in future the Rugby Union Financial year will extend from the date of the Annual General Meeting to that of the next one.

It will be observed that this statement includes one item of receipt and one of payment on account of the year 1929 vs. S.A. 1929. Affiliation fee, and P. O. Box rent Sba. 80/-. This is due to the alteration in date of closing the annual accounts.

The largest item of revenue during the period is profit on the South African Students' Tour—Sba. 6,160/5. This will be referred to later.

The refund from the Naval Visit was the Rugby Union share of £50 presented to H.M.S. Effingham with the idea of presenting them with their concert party. This, however, was graciously re-

fused, and it was then decided by the Rugby Union to hand the sum over to start a permanent fund for Naval Entertainment, the Committee of which would control all future Naval visits.

The item of Sba. 238/-, Johnson Fund, represents money collected at two matches in Nairobi on behalf of one Johnson who was an ex-Rugby Player and lost his earight through a most unfortunate accident. The sum was handed over to the Rugby Union. It was agreed that the amount would be increased by means of special rate receipts to approximate £50 when a cheque would be presented to Mr. Johnson, an expression of sympathy from fellow rugby players.

The items of expenditure do not require much explanation. Sba. 180/- was paid for 9 beds used by the Rugby Union for Nairobi. These are at present stored in the P. W. D. and it is suggested that they be sold possibly to the Navy. Expenditure on the Navy is for no further use for them by the Rugby Union.

Sba. 80/- paid to Nakuru Sports Club represented the offer made between their rate receipts and their expenses at the Rugby week end held at Nakuru. Rugby Union having permission granted Nakuru Sports Club to use a maximum of Sba. 200/- for the week end. This had been made earlier but was un-expectedly used. Nakuru, on their part, were graciously re-

The present balance on hand of the 4,410/0 is made up as follows—

Balance on Johnson Fund Sba. 238/-

The original estimate of total revenue was £800 as against £1,725 actual (of which some £25 is still outstanding).

Expenditure was estimated at £280, but it will be seen from the statement that disbursements amounted to £1,268.

The difficulty of arriving at a true estimate for a visit of this kind still for which there is no precedent cannot be overestimated.

Our receipts far exceeded all hopes or expectations in reaching the sum of £1,725 against an original estimate of £700. I trust thanks are due to all Clubs and districts for this achievement.

The original estimate for the sale of Hand books and advertisements thereon was slightly exceeded. Collections at total did not reach expectation.

With respect to expenditure, the estimate for stater fare was exceeded by £150. This was due to the decision made (and carried into effect) to send the Students back to South Africa last season and to pay the passage of Messrs. Smith and Pinlay.

The items "Cost of Trial" and "Kenya Players Expenses" were very much understated, as well as advertising, Printing and Incidentals. The last named included a sum of Sba. 200/- for incidentals expense incurred by Mr. Smith, as Kenya representative in South Africa during the last 12 months, whilst he was present in his arrangements for this tour.

The remaining items of expenditure had not been provided for, except an amount of Sba. 200/- for laundry of visitors.
