## PROBABLE CAUSE OF SIR H. SEGRAVE'S DEATH.

### Boat Struck by Floating Object.

#### BRANCH OF TREE DISCOVERED.

### Rear Portion of Step Stated to Have Been Torn Off.

Reference as to the probable cause of the accident on Lake Windermere which resulted in the death of Sir Henry Segrave, is now stated to be available.

There are indications that a floating object struck the rear portion of the boat, causing it to be torn off. It is believed that 20 minutes after the disaster, a well-logged branch of a tree was picked up some 500 yards astray of the boat and as near as can be ascertained, is a direct path.

Technical experts have issued a statement to the effect that the boat, engine and transmission gear was all in perfect condition prior to the accident.

It is now being revealed that before he crashed Sir Henry Segrave's boat attained a speed of 30 miles per hour.

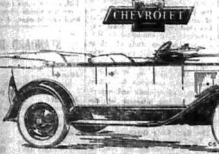
