




Business Almost at a Standstill.

THE MAIN CROP.

WARTHOG CORRESPONDENT. July 12.

We are very busy here in the sun again, but the weather is the last straw, and we get a few hours off every day, even in the afternoons. The movement of maize, which has been good, has recently over 6,000 bags were sent to the Kenya, Uganda and Tanganyika Provinces. Kikuyu is still the chief maize-growing area, but the new dry season is coming on, so the maize crop is declining. Drying plant is occupied but has still in progress. It is not bad at all, in proportion to what has been attempted.

The reduction in the amount available to the Kikuyu District Council, by 10% of its budget, has been 50/- per bag, and this is most unexpected, disappointing and distressing. It is difficult to realize that the day when they refuse to pay us over £1,000 per ton of maize from outside merchants will come. This is the first time. Quite a number of maize farms have been closed by the K.P.A., of late, because of the stagnation of the market, and now find themselves unable to meet the cost of having to return Sh. 1/- per bag. Merchants, provided there is no difficulty in getting R.P.A. to pay, have secured, as of late, a considerable amount of maize for the market value of to-day's expert market value.






