MAIL SERVICES TO EAST AFRICAN PORTS.

General Post Office gives details of the sailing of Indian boats under the mail meeting (June 19) office were made to ensure information regarding the routing arrangements of it was stated that delays might be occasioned on this account.

The Postmaster-General stated that direct mails to India, London and certain large towns in Europe will be sent to East Africa. The mails are sent in the course of transshipment, but are not transferred to African ports necessary at the other side. The mails are sent direct by the Messageries Maritimes.

The position, therefore, is that while the nature of the steamships by which the mails are exported to be conveyed from India are known, scheduled times are not always defined, and it is impossible to say beforehand what ships will be available at Mombasa for the carrying of mails to places along the coast. A ship may be held up at the port working cargo, and may be transferred to another vessel leaving on the same day.

Service Delivery.

With regard to the question of a subsidy, which probably is wanted by the group of a mail contract, the suggestion has been made that the Government should consider the fact that the East African ports, since there is already a contract to operate between East Africa ports, there is already in existence the arrangement mentioned by the Postmaster-General. It would involve the Government in the carrying of mails from India by all available services. It would moreover be a mail less costly.

Reference was made at the last meeting to the discussion which took place in 1928 regarding the cost of a subsidized service for East Africa. When Sir Evelyn Cotton stated that the cost would be from £2000 to £3000. Colonel Baring said that the Colonial Office would consider a bid of £100,000. Both these figures, however, were understood to relate to a direct steamship service, not a subsidized one.

Business by Foreign Countries.

Efforts have, however, been made to ascertain what other countries pay for the conveyance of mails, and while it is known that the South African Government paid £225,000 in respect of the mail service to and from South Africa, no information available as to the actual amounts paid by Japan, India and France by way of subsidies in respect of their East African services.

The British Chamber of Commerce in Paris has been making enquiries for the position in that country, but no definite information has been received.

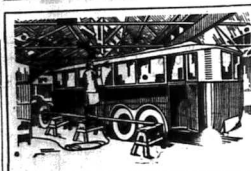

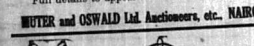

WIRELESS IN EAST AFRICA.

AROUND THE STATIONS.

A Review of Reception.

The "E. A. Standard" has arranged for the regular publication of a wireless page. These Articles, written by Mr. Leslie J. Hughes, a well-known Kenya radio authority, will appear weekly.

It would be the following in the wireless column. It has been a decidedly good one. It was giving a very good record of the last week. "Body and Soul" when packed in Johannesburg was not so good. It was a station that it would be interesting to get definite tones of working from. He has been picked up on about sixty five metres and also his wavelength of four hundred and fifty odd. Unfortunately the writer has only picked him up during speech although it has been reported that he has a musical programme late in the evening—mostly blues or bluesy music. Perhaps some of our Indian friends can give some definite information regarding this station, his time of working, etc. etc.

All the above reception were taken on the Philips 2009 set and checked on the Saba three.

The Gramophone Pick Up. The question has arisen of how to fit a gramophone pick up to a radio set. First and foremost it would be perhaps just as well to consider gramophones and records in general. As is generally known the music is impressed on the record in the form of a spiral track starting from the outside edge of the record and varying in the radius. There are two types of record, those known as "groove cut" in which the cause in the form of the record and valleys at the bottom of the record and the form that is in general now called "needle cut". In the latter case the music is at the side of the track. The sound-hole is not so clearly defined as is so arranged so that these side to side vibrations are transmitted from the needle to the diaphragm by the stylus, which is held at the bottom of the sound-hole. These vibrations which now appear as sound waves are amplified by the trumpet or horn of the instrument which, in modern instruments, is built into the machine.

Two things need to be borne in mind for future reference. The diaphragm must be parallel to the sound groove in the case of the "needle cut record" and at right angles to the record in the case of a "groove cut record".

Secondly, the needle must not be absolutely perpendicular to the record, but should be laid back about 10 degrees in the direction from which the record is travelling. This is to say we shall the needle and record meet at an angle of 20 degrees, measured from the centre of the gramophone from the front to the back. We must bear this in mind when fitting the gramophone pick up in order to minimize record wear.

A lot of time has been spent by gramophone companies on trumpets. The design of a modern gramophone trumpet is the outcome of years of experiment. It must be remembered that a trumpet may have a certain range, or will react in a certain tone itself, with the result that certain notes will be amplified out of proportion to others. Again, the volume of the sound given out entirely depends upon the record. It is not possible to amplify the sound beyond what the record will give. Further the louder the record the more noise there is on the side walls of the record with consequent wear.

The electrical method of reproduction should, in theory, show the utmost possible of "needle picking" and will undoubtedly give the most perfect record wear. The output given will be amplified up to the desired degree of loudness without affecting the record wear in the slightest. Further, signals will be designed with absolute straight line characteristics (that is to say the sound so amplified will be an exact reproduction of the original) and will be not distorted in any way.

Consider the wireless set. If a pair of phones be fitted in the output circuit of the detector, that is between H.T. and the plate in the simplest form, signals will be heard. They will probably be of a detector valve, signals will be suitable for local speaker. If a gramophone pick up be fitted to the gramophone and the telephone be connected to the two terminals on top of the device and the record played, the record will be heard in the ordinary full telephone strength in the telephone.

What is the difference then between the two? Some what "over". Thus our pick up can be used with a two valve low frequency amplifier and loud speaker or better still, adapted to fit our wireless set.

This is arranged for in the Philips set by two small terminals underneath the set. An American sets a phonograph pick of the well known telephone type is fitted. Phonograph in American, means gramophone. The pick up is attached to the terminals of the detector valve and the first L.T. tube. For purposes of volume control a potentiometer is fitted in the circuit of the pick up, generally of the order of 500,000 ohms. The pick up goes to the L.T. bias and the one side of the pick up is common to the ground. The other side of the gramophone and pick up will play the radio.

In some sets the two L.F. valves have a common bias and consequently this device cannot be used. This is especially the case in the Saba short wave set. If the wiring be followed out from the detector valve (Negative grid) bias it will be found that it splits and goes through the screen-grid of both transformers to their respective grids. We must thus in this case take advantage of the first transformer valve. We must thus connect detector valve and first L.F. valve.

Following out the wiring diagram in this case we first of all take out the detector valve. Carefully the pins are removed. Follow out the diagram and it will be seen that none of the connections that do not concern the amplifier side are broken and we can pick out the points we need for in our pick up.

Take out the first L.F. plug (marked Anode 20) and join the pins to the one side of the pick up. The other side of the pick up will go to the second socket from the front on the six pin plug. Follow out the diagram and see that there are no mistakes. Second socket from front goes to common point.

Consider the detector valve and one side of choke coil. As the first transformer is out there is only one path. Through the choke coil, through the primary of the first L.F. transformer and from thence through the multiple lead to Anode 20. Variations due to the music in this circuit will affect the secondary of the first L.F. transformer and that will be impressed on the grid of the first L.F. valve.

S.A.R.L.E. Division 8 Notes. It is interesting to note that the Division 8 notes were first used in the first Royal Lyle, First London. The notes were used on the same day two contacts were made for First Lyle, VGH101 (200M) and VGH102 (100M) and GVP (Airedale).

Right side of the car. He took a revolver from the cupboard and told the driver to pull round. When the car had turned back two or fifteen yards he saw a man lying at the corner of Dalhousie Street.

Sir Charles Tugart ran and ran to the spot. He found the man very badly hurt and he died shortly afterwards. Two bombs and a hand revolver were found in his possession.

Two constables arrested another lady, who was bleeding, and had a revolver and bomb—she was a student.

Sir Charles Tugart added that one bomb struck a constable, damaged two motor cars and the front of a shop. Flares of a bomb pierced the door of his car, one was embedded in the tyre and another slightly injured the driver in the arm.

The bombs were of the Mills type and were made of aluminium alloy.

Japanese Revolvers.

The law student who was arrested in connection with the attempt on Sir Charles Tugart is now in the hands of the police. The police seized by armed outrages are searching a number of houses in the city. It is stated that 5,000 revolvers of Japanese make were recently distributed among the extremist students. Seven arrests were effected at midnight in connection with the attempt on Sir Charles Tugart.

It is understood that the members of a terrorist band who were planning outrages in Calcutta and throughout Bengal. The arrested persons belong to the same body as the Chittagong armoury raiders.

Sir Charles Tugart is a 49-year-old man who has been in the Indian army since 1901.

A CIVIL SERVICE COMMISSION.
(Continued from page 1.)

Mr. O'Shea said he would like Mr. Hoey to be made on the 1931 estimate. During the last five or six years the system of the country had been increasing, and in consequence there had been considerable differences on the part of the Government. This year they were faced with an entirely new situation. It was widely recognized that the Government was not doing its duty in connection with the 1931 estimate, and it was generally supposed to be a matter of Government's view to cutting down expenditure to what was the Government's opinion the lowest possible. But it could not be understood that Government's policy should differ from that. Now was the time of the minimum, and which expenditures should be cut down their rates.

United Staff.

It would be necessary for the United Members of this meeting to be very careful indeed to propose a strong policy, and to be absolutely united in their recommendations. Mr. O'Shea was in the 1931 estimate, and it was impossible to do so without the aid of the public to have any effect on the subject. He said that if they must wait and see what direction Government had been applying the estimates. Then it would be for the United Members to go through the estimates from their point of view and put counter-proposals. Mr. Hoey, with his previous experience on the Council, should be of considerable help.

Out of Proportion.

As one of the things to which Mr. Hoey would like to draw attention again, he said that the cost of the Civil Service of the country, in his opinion, after examining the costs for over 21 years, was disproportionately high in relation to the service in the country. That applied not only to the European staff, but to the Indian, Greek, and native.

What he meant was taking the case of the native, that the return for his wages and other costs was not proportionate. He was not altogether in favour of the wages paid the native employee. He had definitely ascertained that labour given in return for the wages paid to native labour was not by any means adequate.

Turning to the Asiatic staff, much the same would apply.

When one came to the European staff, the situation was even more unfortunate. There had been very much mismanagement by members of the Service in the connection. He would not say that the idea of the Service should be organized. It did not seem to him that the Service could not maintain any individual who was in the world on a very low rate of salary, and there were quite a number of grades who were not appreciated at all. But when one got outside that pay one found other costs of the Civil Service which were greatly extravagant. The two and a half years period of service was an outstanding example.

Others of the Government familiar with a hundred and one other ways in which they received increased remuneration, would agree that when those things were added together it made the Service unacceptably high in relation to the terms of the Government.

United Staff.

Only recently, Mr. O'Shea informed the meeting, they had been informed that the Secretary of State had turned down the report signed by senior officers of the Government and elected Members and approved by the Governor for a revision of the terms of service of European officers.

He would therefore suggest to Mr. Hoey to take up the question of the appointment of a Commission to inquire into the organization of the Government Service of the country (in brief). It was very necessary. It was very necessary to have a period of years to examine the situation, and he had tried hard to get the matter altered, but up to date have failed completely.

The only way to do it was to have a Commission, which would include a senior officer of the Colonial Office, in that way bringing the Colonial Office into touch with the inquiry. In addition, there would be senior members of the Government, a representative of the Civil Service Association and representatives of the country, would be helpful. It was a representative of the organization of the Civil Service in keeping with the requirements of the country and yet for the Service staff. (Hear, hear.)

They were mostly out of proportion to service needed. Figures are entirely from the point of view of the individual pay they received, but their outlay. This Service is expected on a very extravagant scale, and it is in these conditions that the cost would be much higher than it should be.

He said that if they must wait and see what direction Government had been applying the estimates. Then it would be for the United Members to go through the estimates from their point of view and put counter-proposals. Mr. Hoey, with his previous experience on the Council, should be of considerable help.

Out of Proportion.

As one of the things to which Mr. Hoey would like to draw attention again, he said that the cost of the Civil Service of the country, in his opinion, after examining the costs for over 21 years, was disproportionately high in relation to the service in the country. That applied not only to the European staff, but to the Indian, Greek, and native.

What he meant was taking the case of the native, that the return for his wages and other costs was not proportionate. He was not altogether in favour of the wages paid the native employee. He had definitely ascertained that labour given in return for the wages paid to native labour was not by any means adequate.

Turning to the Asiatic staff, much the same would apply.
