**A FAMILY GATHERING.**

**All Working Together in Pursuit of  
 Common Ideals.**

During the course of an interview, Mr. J. H. Thomas, Secretary of State for the Dominions, who will be one of the United Kingdom delegates to the Imperial Conference, outlined the main issues before the Conference. He emphasized that it was a family gathering, working together in pursuit of common ideals.

The broad principles of the constitutional status of the Dominions had, he said, already been settled. The definition of the position of mutual relations of the group of self-governing communities composed of Great Britain and the Dominions was laid down in terms which were well known.

He referred to the Special Conference last year on merchant shipping legislation, and said that the recommendations made it clear that the Dominions were in no way subordinate to the United Kingdom.

The question of foreign policy and defence would be discussed, and in this connection it was of vital importance in the interests of the Commonwealth that the members move forward hand in hand. This advance of each joint action would greatly exceed any influence exerted by any one member acting alone.

Registration Starts To-day  
 in Nairobi.

THE PROCEEDING

The work of getting into the Registration of Domestic Servants has already started. On Monday, applications were distributed in Areas A and F to prepare householders, and to-day domestic servants can be registered, from Area A at Fichanga Police Station and from Area F at the M.A.D. office, the Central Post Office. It should be noted that at the former place registration is possible from 9 a.m. to 12:30 p.m., daily until further notice, and at the latter place from 9 a.m. to 5:40 p.m.

EFFECTS OF OSCILLATION.

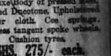

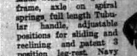

## GERMAN FINANCIAL REPORT.

Proposals to Lower the Budget Deficit.

### BACKLOGS AND DEFICITS TO BE TACKLED.

(STANDARD CORRESPONDENT.)  
 Berlin, Sept. 29. The Chancellor Herr Brüning has submitted to President Hindenburg the Government's financial reform programme. To cover the budget deficit of 257,000,000 due to unemployment and the decline in revenue, and to prevent a further deficit in the coming year it is understood that the salaries of Cabinet Ministers will be reduced by 30 per cent and the salaries of all state officials by 10 per cent. The unemployment insurance tax will be increased by 10 per cent and the tax on tobacco and matches will probably be increased. Proposals by Government departments will be reviewed by October 10.

It is anticipated that the Reichstag which will meet on October 13, will reject the programme. The Government is therefore likely to announce Parliament will adjourn in the autumn and to adjourn Parliament until the Spring.

### NEW TAXATION.

Berlin, Sept. 29. The Government's financial proposals have been published, and generally follow the forecast previously made. Departmental expenditures will be reduced by 213,000,000. The deficit of 257,000,000 will be covered by 10 per cent, (including an income tax, higher, and a 10 per cent, and the increased tobacco tax, an expected 100,000,000 additional 218,000,000).

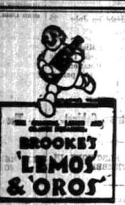

DELEGATES LOYAL GREETINGS.

The first meeting of the Imperial Conference took place in the Locarno Room of the Foreign Office, when the Prime Minister and other Cabinet Ministers of Great Britain and the 16 Dominions were present. Mr. Ramsay Macdonald was elected Chairman of the Conference.

The first act of the Conference, on the motion of Mr. Macdonald, seconded by General Hertzog, was to telegraph its loyal greetings to the King and Queen, to which His Majesty briefly returned his thanks and appreciation for the message.

Mr. Ramsay Macdonald formally welcomed the delegates to the Conference and referred to the fact that four Prime Ministers, like himself, were attending their first Imperial Conference.

He stated that the agenda before the Conference dealt broadly with three main questions, viz., the constitutional status of the individual members of the British Commonwealth of Nations, foreign affairs, and economic problems as a result of the depression in trade. Mr. Macdonald reviewed these subjects in detail.

The leading delegates of all the Dominions replied to the speech of welcome, and emphasised the need for Imperial co-operation on the economic question. Particular reference was made to the interdependence of reciprocal tariff benefits.

INTER-IMPERIAL RELATIONS.
