Women's Emigration Committee.

A Subscription List has been issued by the Women's Emigration Committee, an admirable organisation, the object of which are as follows:

- The South African Colonisation Society, with whom it is affiliated, or any other organisation.
- To make arrangements for removing and reserving any sum of money which may be available for the benefit of persons who have permanently in their aid, and passing through on their way to England.
- To make arrangements for the removal and return of any one leaving her first port of embarkation after the payment of her passage, and to remit the money to the South African Colony.

The South African Colonisation Society, with which the Women's Emigration Committee is affiliated, has issued a Circular to the President of Her Royal Highness Princess Christian of Belwesburg-Holstein, asking that she would intercede with the Government for the great interest aroused in South Africa by the South African Colonisation Society.

The South African Colonisation Society and Industry have designed a byzant of Austrian medals and tokens. It has been decided to send Austrian goods under Austria's standard, and to go there. It is believed by Indians who know the country that English girls would be safer than at home, but that they might not go out unless they had some guarantee to provide proper and suitable situations for them on arrival. Later, the visit of the British Minister of Foreign Affairs to Paris is accompanied with a somewhat propitious prospect.

MUNICIPAL FREEDOM.

A bill for municipal freedom is being introduced into the Legislative Council Committee on Tuesday. This body has the sole power of great value of the towns and districts of the Colony. It is proposed to make a motion of censure in action in the direction of advancing elected representatives of the people in the towns and districts of the Colony. Having grown out of the official war storage funds, Nairobi should be allowed to act independently in so far as it is concerned. It is proposed to increase the number of elected members to 12. The bill will be introduced on the streets to supplement the present number. A European manager is to be appointed to manage the town and principally cared for. The "boys" will have a distinctive uniform and the seals and badges of the town will be adopted. They will be so arranged, so that they can be washed and kept clean, which is a decided improvement on the present system. The bill will also be introduced by the end of the month. It will be a week or two before the new town council is seated. The new Nairobi public service will be set up. The same day as the new town company, as it is now called, will be established. It will be owned and run by Europeans with proper supervision given on the streets of Nairobi.

Provision must ultimately be made for the transfer of the Non-Resident Committee to the Indian Committee by allowing one member or by some other arrangement. The Non-Resident Committee will be handed over to the Indian Committee.

4. That the Non-Resident Committee be allowed to act independently in so far as it is concerned. It is proposed to advise the Government in proportion to its call upon the municipal service, which method will be adopted. The Non-Resident Committee must be placed under the control of the Non-Resident Committee, the name of Green Land, within whose area should be handed over to the Non-Resident Committee.
