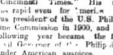



FINDING THE ROLE OF THE TSETSE

Fascinating Work Done in Tanganyika.

THE GAME PROBLEM.

The Department of Tsetse Borne in Tanganyika, which is under the experienced charge of Mr. G. F. M. Symonds, has just issued two interesting reports. The first is entitled "Co-ordination Reports" and the other a common statement of progress over a brief period together with an outline of the programme to follow.

The reports contain some very interesting facts. The first of the documents covers the period from October in 1935 to February 28, 1936. It is indicated that the efforts of the Department were keenly directed towards clearing all the tsetse to be known regions, and, in addition, the environment, relations, the economy and circumstances of the tsetse.

In the western fly belt at Kondebani an investigator has produced data which indicated the existence of centres of denser fly with a higher proportion of females than the surrounding population. In the eastern belt another official investigation is in progress including in May, a decrease in July and August, and a high catch in December, April and May.

The problem of plants shaded or favoured by the fly is being studied and the object of the research is to define the fundamental principles governing the role of the fly in nature.

The Game Problem

In the Sambara region, where both fly and game are both moderately numerous or sparse according to the season, an extensive study indicates a suggestive relation between the presence of parties of large game and the abundance and feeding of the fly. "Centres" rich in Sambara, Kondebani and the eastern fly belt, where game is abundant, so far as the tsetse is concerned, consist of game alone influence the distribution of fly.

In another area, likewise, in the eastern belt, interesting experiments are in hand—namely, the alteration by experimental means of the major factors, such as temperature, light, evaporation, and soil, which—through increasing the density vegetation cover on one field and decreasing it on the other. The lines followed in—

(1) The study of plant succession which helps to test the possibilities of obtaining continuous cover, and (2) the study of such an extent that they would be unfavourable to tsetse.

(3) By aiding the process of succession in suitable communities by manipulating seedling trees and shrubs and by sowing seeds of native and exotic species in prepared spots.

(4) The raising of plant communities upon open areas.

(5) The taking of measurements, book-keeping and burning of the fly density in the game and surrounding country and when the game density, the density of vegetation.

At the end of the "long" rains there was a rapid and great increase in the number of young flies which was maintained at the level of the coldest part of the cool season. It is considered by the observer that some factor associated with the cold winter decrease the number of old fly.

Investigations in the Eastern belt suggest that sex proportions of fly in the field are approximately equal. The females appear in their true proportions in the relatively exposed, less-open areas of swamp. Flies caught during the day while those found in well-wooded areas are wild and are very almost entirely male. The swamps are said to be the feeding grounds for both from which they return to the well-wooded areas where the females remain inactive.

Food Problem

The rate of digestion and the degree of hunger in fly have also been under enquiry. Interesting experiments were carried out to determine the use of the sexes in the search for food. Fly were blinded by painting their eyes; the sense of smell was reduced functionally by coating the antennae. It was found that the latter were less sensitive to food and the unilaterally long antennae were made appeared to affect the longevity. Hatched flies when placed in the field were blind in feeding and were much healthier than those which simultaneously treated. Thus treated and normal flies were roughly equal in survival.

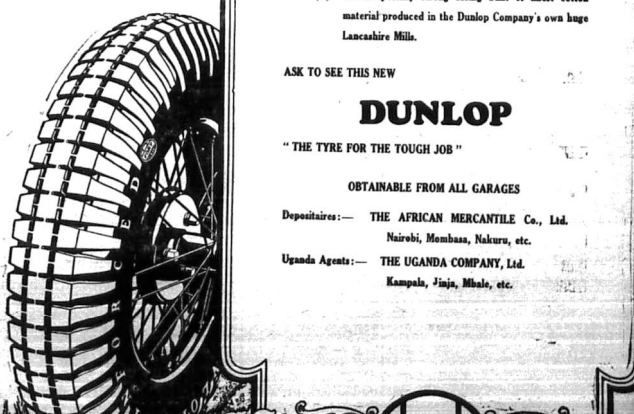

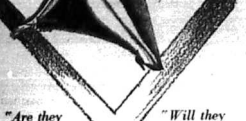

KENYA CRICKET COMMITTEE.

Constitution of Proposed New Association.

A meeting of the Kenya Cricket Committee was held at the Police Officers' Mess recently when the following were present: Col. Spicer (in the chair), Messrs. Dalziel (Honorary Treasurer), Major (Honorary Secretary), Mr. E. K. Law, Mr. Hahn (President), and the following have been read, the suggested rules were finally decided upon for the purpose of forming the constitution of the Association. 1. The Association shall be called the Kenya Cricket Association. 2. The objects of the Association shall be:

- (a) To uphold the laws of the game as at present adopted by the M.C.C. (England).
- (b) To regulate, arrange, and manage all competitions and tours.
- (c) To decide all doubtful and disputed points in connection with the laws and the Laws and Regulations thereof.
- (d) Generally to advance the interests of the game.
- 3. The Association shall consist of European clubs.
- 4. The Association shall have its headquarters in Nairobi.
- 5. The Association shall be managed by a Council consisting of the following officers: A President, three vice-presidents, hon. secretary, hon. treasurer, one representative appointed by each affiliated club. The Council shall comprise not less than four executive members together with less than seven other councilors. There shall be a quorum.

- (a) A representative of an affiliated club need not necessarily be a member of that club, but may only represent said club on behalf of that club.
 - (b) The Council shall have the power to appoint sufficient councilors by being the Council to minimum strength in the event of insufficient club representatives having been nominated.
 - 6. That the annual subscription of the Association shall be Shs. 10/- per club.
 - 7. The Hon. Secretary, the Hon. Treasurer, the members of the Council, and auditors, shall retire annually and shall themselves be eligible for re-election.
 - 8. The President, Vice-President, shall be elected for a period of three years, when they shall retire, but they shall be eligible for re-election.
- It was agreed that a copy of these rules should be forwarded to all cricket clubs in the Colony for favour of criticism and general comment.

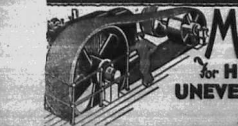

Black Spot on Rose Trees. The following article has been taken from "The Rose Annual," 1929, the most authoritative work on roses yet published.

The havoc caused by Black Spot has not only become more constant to those growing roses, but it has become a disease which it believes all of us who grow roses, whether as amateurs or professionals, to do well to know something about. In the Rose Annual for 1929, I mentioned a short paper on Black Spot, in which you gave the life history of the fungus, so far as we know, and the methods I advocated for combating the disease.

This treatment, I admit might appear to be over elaborate and rather more theoretical than practical, but I have realized my own mistakes, and Black Spot is a more serious pest than I first thought. It is not a very small local pest. It is an insidious pest that at the result requires very early treatment on the lines I have mentioned in my paper. It would have been decidedly better from the disease but for reasons I have mentioned in my paper.

For instance, this year with but two exceptions, the only new case of Black Spot occurred on a completely new rose bush, and was seen about a month after training and spraying with Bordeaux. The fungus is not seen on plants until September on Climbers and on near the buds on other roses. These later attacks I can only attribute to infection from the buds of the previous year. QUESTIONS AND ANSWERS. In view of the really serious nature of the present epidemic of black spot, I have been asked by the Editor to offer the members which, with our restricted knowledge, seem to offer the best chance of checking the disease. In obeying this I am obliged to say that a good deal of the work in the 1929 Annual, and in the 1930 Annual, has been devoted to this subject.

To understand properly the problem before us we have to remember that black spot is caused by a fungus (Diplodia Rosea) growing inside the buds of roses and only coming to the surface for "seedling" purposes, so that the amount of spraying is determined by the amount of the fungus in the buds. It is not the number of the fungus which is the cause of the disease, but the spores which are produced, which are the cause of the disease.
