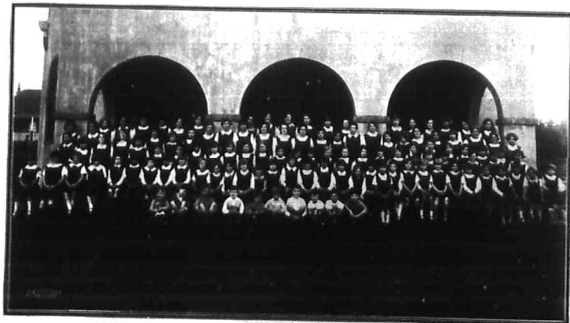

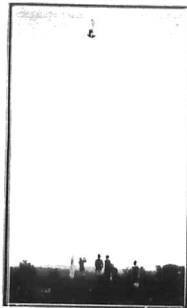

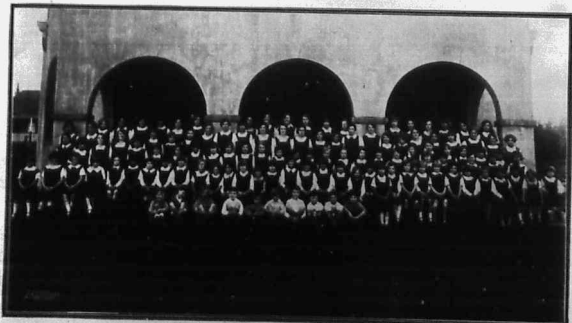

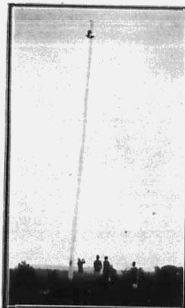

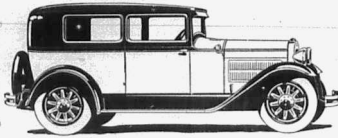

WELFARE IN RUANDA-URUNDI. Report to League of Nations for 1928.

The Belgian mandated territory in East Africa comprises an extensive stretch of country east of Lake Tanganyika and Lake Tanganyika Territory. It is bounded to the north by Uganda, and to the east by about 75,000 square miles, or 13,540,000 acres, which is almost equally divided between Ruanda in the north and Urundi in the south. About one per cent of the land is suitable for agriculture and afforestation.

The latest report (1928) of the Belgian Government, presented to the League of Nations by M. Hans Jansz, the Belgian Colonial Minister, contains a list of interesting information as to the "African World."

The leading and vital problems which stir our interest in other parts of Africa are met with here in all their apparently intractable and stubborn persistence, only perhaps even more so. Above all the impact of European civilization on African and African mentality is accompanied here, as elsewhere, with the most difficult and perplexing consequences. Here, as assumed the role of educator, the policy largely adopted in accordance with African development; the policy adopted, and the native has been successful in making the most of himself by his own efforts, mainly through the medium of his own traditions, language, and customs.

As the amount of success achieved in this part of Africa does not appear to have been too brilliant. The attempt made to leave the natives as much as possible to themselves, to encourage them to manage their own affairs a little more efficiently and intelligently; the attempts to determine definite offices to educate the child and notable up to a certain minimum stage of progressive responsibility, have not, in Ruanda-Urundi, been conspicuously successful.

The present report, in fact, has much to say about dissipation and idleness, and even revolt in some quarters. The Belgian King, in the face of spirit of treachery, as it has been to meet and stimulate the habits and notables in the villages, in the field of administrative and judicial procedure, but very often with disappointing results. At the same time there is no need to emphasize the things and ignore the successes. Steady progress is undoubtedly being made, but it is very up to task.

This part of East Africa of late years has seen a number of the King and members of the Belgian administration to the extent. Native agriculture appears to be stagnant and to native industry must be added the great violence of a drought which pervades some of only the natives would show a little forward and care for the future and even subsequent steps of kind in looking their relations and laying up for a rainy day, or rather, in the event of a famine season, but with their usual habits, probably the most stubborn and difficult trait in their mental makeup, which they have to deal with, they think only of the present and the immediate children of the hour that is now, they care for the future.

Manually Independent.
The report says (page 67, Annex to Part III): "The national improvement, of which the most that destiny involves, has characteristic features in the removal of adversity, and above all, the infection of collective development resulting from occasional failure, are all cumulative factors which prevent any effective resistance to the force of universal famine."

An excellent map is given at the end, and it is one rather unique feature, an entire absence of railways, and this is certainly one of the most remarkable features in the thousands and tens of miles, with all the other things that naturally a quarter of an inch of territory is without the ordinary line of watercourses, and in fact, another. If these are all based on definite survey, which is hardly possible, then Ruanda-Urundi, is the best watered territory in all Africa.

Turning to the commercial and industrial side, as developed solely by Europeans and other non-native peoples, there is certainly in 1928, 151 commercial establishments in Urundi and 64 in Ruanda, making 215 in all, as compared with 122 in 1926. More than 154 were under Arab control, 70 under Belgian, and only 20 European. The child items in the Import trade are kuduhide, and in the export trade hides and skins.

Manchester Trade Increase.
The Manchester Trade Report for 1929 was received in printed form yesterday. It shows that the value of imports was £22,140 and that of export £2,200 lakhs. In 1928, total trade was £1,400 lakhs and in 1929 it rose to £2,425 lakhs. Customs revenue also increased.

THE MORRIS "EKS"

Test Under Grievous Conditions.

Just as there is always a glamour about any new model which is produced by the great Crowley firm of Morris Motors Ltd., so is it extremely understandable that the British built car produced on lines which point to a complete new mechanical method, as it is the case with the recently produced Morris "Eks". That if it bears these indications, nevertheless, it deserves its own distinct individuality. It is utterly and completely unlike any machine that has ever turned out by the Morris factories. The "Eks" can be described as the fruit of the world tour carried out by Sir William Morris some two years ago, undertaken in order that he might study at first hand that layover required and expected. It is designed specifically to operate over the roughest country.

The external appearance of the "Eks" shows to what extent the designer has endeavored to have been carried, particularly in the case of the saloon, and it effects an indication of the character of the car, as well as of the nature of its performance. 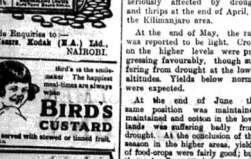

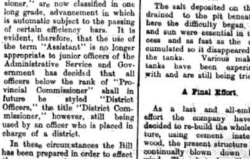

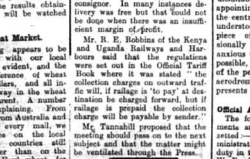
