Advocates of the Colony. The majority of seats had been assigned to do so, could have four or a formula which would have been acceptable to all parties. He had instead outlined his view and in doing so related the real intentions of the European Elected Members in the more possible light without any intention. Some of them, he was glad to see, refrained from their rise against the passage of the Bill, having made their objection clear, but it is to be regretted that the atmosphere of goodwill which has characterized this measure has been shattered by Downing Street and that the weight of continental authority has had to be used in the passage of a measure which, with more understanding, would have issued from the Council the free and unanimous gift of the country to the Native people. We are glad indeed that the measure has passed, although we question its wisdom in its unmodified clause and we have no doubt at all—whatever Lord Passfield's views may be—that the European committee of Kenya will do all in their power to make the Ordinance workable. We are equally sure, however, that in the course of a few years there will have to be a more liberal view at the Colonial Office in respect of the discharge of this responsibility than there is at the present time, since the interests of the African people will be the first to suffer.

**A Game Conference.**

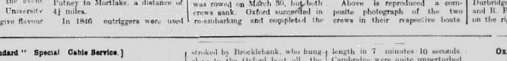
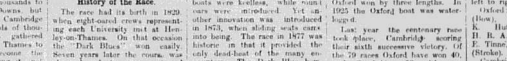

No event in the world of sport attracts anything like the attention that the Boat Race draws. The lively crews at thousands of the historic Epsom Downs, but the annual Oxford and Cambridge boat race, held hundreds of thousands of spectators gathered along the banks of the Thames to witness what has become the greatest event in rowing if not in sport. It would be difficult to assign a reason for this interest, particularly when but a very small section of the crowd can be considered partisan since they are no graduates of either Varsity. The boat race has become the event of the season. The University atmosphere is there to give flavour and spice, but it is the public who have invested in with the riches which it yields.

**History of the Race.**  
The race had its birth in 1829 when eight-oared crews representing each University met at Henley-on-Thames. On that occasion the "Dark Blues" won easily seven years later the course was changed and the race contested near Westminster in Putney. In 1846, 1856, and 1868, course changes were again made in these years the race taking place between Mortlake and Putney. In 1869 the present course was adopted from Putney to Mortlake a distance of 4 miles.

In 1866 outriggers were used

for the first time. It was seven years later that the present style of rigging was first adopted. The boats were hollow, while oars were made of iron. Yet another innovation was introduced in 1873, when sliding seats came into being. The race in 1877 was historic in that it provided the only distasteful of the many encounters. The Dark Blues however managed to win that race.

**Unparalleled Incident.**  
Coming to more recent days the 1912 race provided an incident without parallel. The race was held on March 30, but both crews sank. Oxford succeeded in re-embarking and completed the

course, but the umpire decided that it was "no race." On April 1 the race was rowed again, when Oxford won by three lengths. In 1922 the Oxford boat was waterlogged.

Last year the contrary race took place, Cambridge scoring their sixth successive victory, the 29 times Oxford have won since success was that secured by the Dark Blues who won in this time from 1899 until 1908. The shortest time was that of the Oxford crew in 1911, 19 min. 29 sec. Above is reproduced a composite photograph of the two crews in their respective boats.

**Oxford Wins the Toss.**

Cambridge won the Boat Race by a length. The race rowed in a strong south west wind. Oxford won the toss about the Surrey side, which then a considerable advantage. Cambridge led slightly from Craven Steps where crews leave. Cambridge lead at Craters Wharf, but at 310 yards Cambridge lead slightly. Oxford's crew again lead. At Clawsick Boat Oxford by half a length. At Dukes Wharf, Oxford was still in lead. At Bull Head Cambridge slightly and at White Heart Cambridge by one length. Oxford crew reduce the lead but Cambridge further ahead by their stroke, and at Mortlake they were a good length ahead. Oxford made magnificent start at the end. The official time was 19 min. 15 seconds—British Official Rowing Service.

**VICTORY FOR CAMBRIDGE**

**Seventh Successive Win for Light Blues.**  
**ROWED IN RAIN STORM.**

Cambridge, who have been placed by Brookbank, who hang close to the Oxford boat all the way, creating his opportunity to sprint ahead into the lead, went to the front at Duke's Meadows. The Light Blues drew away and led at Barnes Bridge by three-quarters of a length in the early part of the race in 19 min. 9 seconds.

The Cambridge crew finished very weak, but most of the Oxford men were rowing well.

Superior stamina and the necessity of reserve strength, plus the nerve of the stroke to avoid the opportunity to go forward gained Cambridge their seventh victory in succession.

**FINISH OF THE WAR.**

(Trust of Reuters Agency)  
London, April 12.—The boat race between Oxford and Cambridge was the final post-war event, which gave the second best time since the race was resumed following the war.

Winning the race Oxford chose the Surrey side and started off rowing thirty-seven to the minute, and Cambridge thirty-six. At the mile post the Light Blues were lead, the time being 4 minutes 48. At Hammersmith Bridge Oxford led by three-quarters of a

length in 7 minutes 10 seconds. Cambridge were quite unimpaired and stuck to it. Rowing steadily and rhythmically they gradually reduced the lead until at the bridge the two boats were again level. The Dark Blues then called on their reserves and went half a length into the lead again at Clawsick Steps. The time being 11 minutes 30 seconds. This split left the Cambridge crew unimpaired. It failed to rattle them in the slightest, at the three mile post the crews were again level, and it was at this point Cambridge made their effort. They gradually drew into the lead, and Oxford, for the first time during the course of the race, were behind at Riverbank Meadows. Rowing mechanical fashion and with mental calculation the Light Blues shot Barnes Bridge in 15 minutes 10 seconds, with a half length lead. Oxford then made a great start, but failed to make any impression.

Several of the Oxford crew were completely rowed out at the close, while Cambridge were quite unimpaired.

The official distance was given as two lengths, and this being 19 minutes 15 seconds, the time being corrected, to 19 minutes 9 seconds.

**STANDARD CORRESPONDENT.**

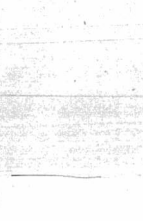

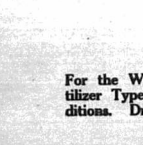

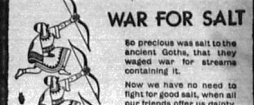
