### "POWER TO STEP IN"

The long awaited Report of the Simon Commission has now appeared complete. The second volume dealing with the constitutional reforms was published yesterday.

The Commissioners recommend the abolition of dyarchy in India and the substitution of a system which will lead, by natural steps, to a federation of the Indian Provinces.

Each scheme would leave the door open for the institution of the Indian States, now ruled by Princes, whom these rulers feel that they should not have such association with British India.

It is therefore proposed that the aim should be a Federal Government, excluding Burma which should have its own government.

### Provincial Freedom.

The scheme aims at giving a maximum of Provincial autonomy consistent with the common interests of India as a whole. Each Province should be as far as possible a "mistress in her own house."

As independent life would thus be given to the Provinces, Larger Legislative Councils are proposed and in the absence of a Hindu-Muslim agreement, the communal franchise must remain, with reservation of seats for depressed classes.

### The Franchise.

The franchise should be extended from the present figure of 2.5% to 10 per cent. with an increase in the ratio of women voters.

The full force of majority rule will be mitigated by the fact that while the majority will be the criterion of the Province who will act for the Governor-General.

Changes are contemplated to meet the need for a Central Organ, which will be in the future a representative more and more of the spirit of the Federation.

The Governor-General would be the real and active head of the Government and represent the King-Emperor, not the Secretary of State.

### Alternative Power.

As an absolute condition of the political development of India, the gateway of the twenty years' experiment must be safely held for at least five years by the present British troops, but they may be necessary, discharging an Imperial Function.

### BRIDGE BUILDING AT MALINDI.

#### Assessing Steel Structure.

(MALINDI, JUNE 26.)  
The steel piers for the Bahab Bridge have at last been transported to the banks of the river, near the bridge site. The cost of assembling the steel is to be begun this week. When the complete bridge is assembled, it is to be pulled forward, bow by bow, on a trolley, the trolley being on rollers to support the bridge, until it is exactly resting on the concrete pier on the South side, and the concrete abutment built up on the coral rock on the other.

All the timber for the plan was cut in the Ambaka Forest at Malé, and had to be transported by tractor and lorry, sixteen miles up to and through the road, and out five miles to the bridge along the North Road. This road is situated up to the heavy traffic very well indeed; all our roads are very bad in Malé, but the road to the embankment leading to the pier in the river is now being very largely improved, and the road widened.

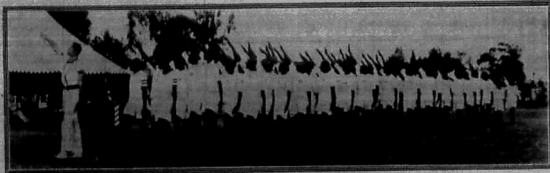

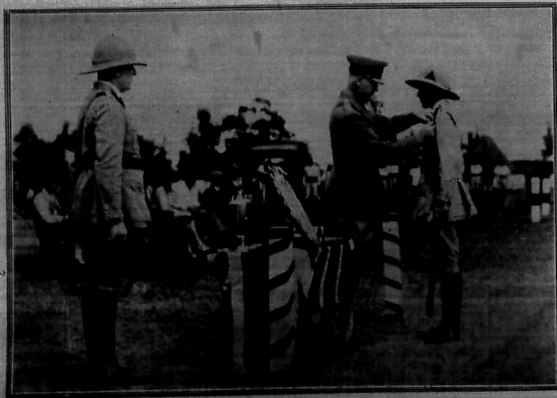

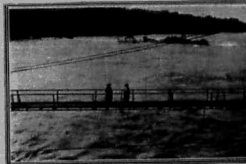

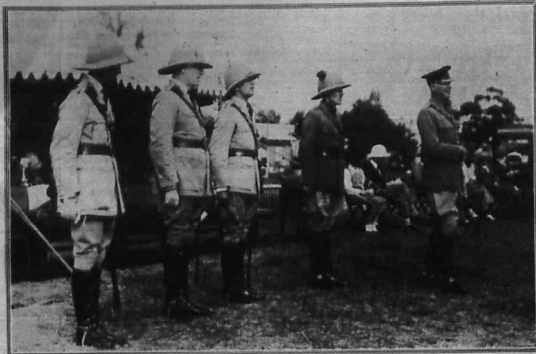

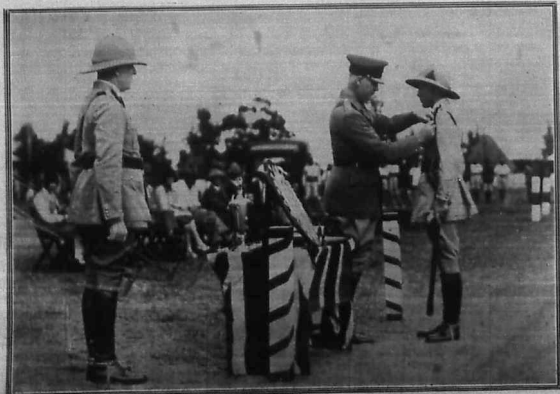

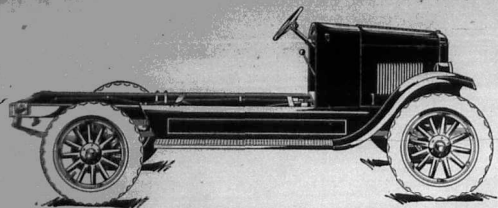
