ROAD COMPETITION WITH THE RAILWAY.

Increasing Gravity of Kenya Problem.

TRANSPORT "PIRATES."

Government Assurance of an Immediate Enquiry.

A motion was carried by the Legislative Council on Thursday evening by Hon. G. Dewey Harvey (Lake) asking Government to take immediate steps and measures to end competition with the railway and to insist that the Attorney-General appointed a committee of enquiry to inquire into the cause of competition and which had not yet been taken to meet the emergency. Given this assurance, Mr. Harvey moved, after a brief debate, that steps be taken to make immediate and complete competition with the railway impossible.

In November, 1917, he said, a Bill and Trade Committee was constituted to inquire into the matter, and in respect of the composition of the committee, he said, "any traffic, competitive with that of the railway, must necessarily affect railway revenue." The Attorney-General had been asked to appoint a committee to inquire into the cause of competition, but he urged that other steps be taken to meet the emergency.

On November, 1917, he said, a Bill and Trade Committee was constituted to inquire into the matter, and in respect of the composition of the committee, he said, "any traffic, competitive with that of the railway, must necessarily affect railway revenue." The Attorney-General had been asked to appoint a committee to inquire into the cause of competition, but he urged that other steps be taken to meet the emergency.

The second reading would count much the sympathy of most of the members of the House, he said, if the bill were considered. If the railway was to be compelled to give up its monopoly there were two alternatives: either a reduction in rates or a reduction in costs in connection with the railway, which would result in a reduction of the cost of the carriage of a commodity, or a reduction in road transportation.


