## Four Aeroplanes Lost in the Mediterranean.

Details of the collision between H.M.S. Aircraft-carrier "Glorious" and the French liner "Florida" homeward bound from Buenos Aires, disclose the fact that, as the line of impact the "Glorious" was steaming at 30 knots an hour to the rescue of a squadron which had fallen into the sea during manoeuvres. The "Florida" was steaming at 17 knots an hour when the vessels met almost head-on.

Four aeroplanes which were operating from the "Glorious" but were on her deck after the collision were lost at sea. The crews were rescued.

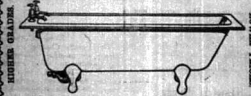

Sir Edward: I am not suggesting the African should be represented in the Council by a white man created by the process carried out in the Colonies.

Lord Dickson: In your Council you say you would not have any right of voting given to an African, unless you had a certain European portion of the country?

Sir Edward: I have suggested that in the European portion of the country there should be a certain number of white inhabitants similar to those in the remainder. It is a very different part of the native population in any one country.

Lord Dickson: Is that a proposal of not voting the question of the natives before them from their own administrative bodies?

**North Kenya Notes.**

CANDIDATES ADDRESS A POLITICAL MEETING.

"STANDARD" CORRESPONDENT.—Times, March 29.—At a well-attended Political Meeting was held at the Hilton Hotel on Wednesday, March 25, at which both the political aspirants for the West Kenya Constituency, Capt. Kenney and Capt. Oetler, spoke.

Capt. Oetler, the first speaker, explained his political, economic and retirement, pointing out that H.R. Gordon, who had already effected a notable reduction.

Death Duties.—He suggested the abolition of Death Duties, which were especially hard on a widow who left a wife and children dependent on her estate, usually consisting of land and stock, which, when widows might be assumed at considerably more for Death Duty purposes than the actual value of a husband's estate, that might have to take place in order to pay these Death Duties, thus causing very great hardship. He also thought, by the abolition of these duties, our capital would be encouraged to this country.

**Education.**

He stated he was in favour of increased facilities for the education of European children, many of whose parents paid an education tax but were unable, owing to financial difficulties, etc., to take their children to school. Many of these children were poorly educated and might become a great source of trouble to the Colony in the years to come, by the introduction of a Four White policy.

**Rural Cens.**

Capt. Oetler said that, although he, personally, did not entirely agree with the principle of a Rural Cens, he realised that the settlers with whom he spoke on the subject were in favour of its introduction, and he would therefore support their views were enforced by telling the meeting that he had been in the country for 26 years and had only been out of it for the four years of the War and for a holiday of six weeks. He thought the Colony was exceedingly healthy and eminently suited for White settlement.

After his speech, Captain Oetler answered several questions put forward by the Chairman of the North Kenya Settlers' Association.

EQUALITY AN AIM

"Civilization Test" as the Basis of the Franchise.

Evidence on the East African problem has been given before the Joint Committee in London by representatives of the Aborigines Protection Society. The oral evidence was accompanied by a memorandum published in the form of extracts below.

The Society attaches the greatest importance to the establishment of equal rights and equal opportunity to all equal franchise on a civilization or 'civilization test' as the goal of citizenship and does not believe the African is unable to play his part.

It is hoped the Committee will make recommendations concerning the basis of a "Civilization Test" and a Common Roll.

Pending effective native representation on the Legislative Council, it is suggested that the Native should have opportunity through Local, Provincial and Central Councils.

The principles of returning Native Taxation to the natives, the abolition of Forced Labour, readjustment of the system of Justice and the 'non-segregation' of agricultural activity are also laid down.

On the subject of Forced Labour the Memorandum says: 'Most experienced Administrators are now prepared to most unanimously agree that it is not, taking everything into consideration, an idle colloquialism. There is a good deal of truth in such a statement. You think you are a white man that you can sit there doing nothing.'

which actually will be 7,000,000 to 10,000,000. Out of a total estimated population numbering 25,000,000 and an acreage of 1,000,000, only 15,000 natives are qualified by strength and education to take advantage of a naturally abundant supply of the franchise.

The Legislature.

Should the Joint Committee on African Union have been formed, it is possible that any special legislative proposals that may be introduced by the non-constituents of the territory, we cannot but be surprised to find that the committee is merely a branch and provides no real representation of the non-constituents of the territory. It is not clear how the African Union will be brought into line with the rest of the world's free nations under the Charter.

As indicated, the Committee of the Anti-Slavery and Aborigines Protection Society does not view the former the appointment of a number of members to represent the African Union as one which can only provide a representation of the people of the territory. It is the opinion of the community which we represent in native writing that the section in the Native Commission is in fact a representation of the African Union, and we are well-versed in native legislation regarding native and their affairs.
