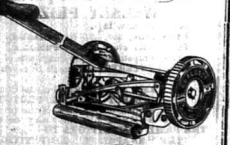

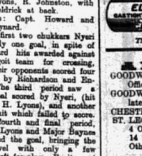

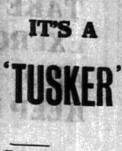

were brought to an end in a further friendly interchange of views and possibly agreement. Among the main subjects discussed were the best means of giving effect to a constructive measure to the decision taken by the London Conference.

"The British and German Ministers then reviewed the general trade position and measures which might contribute to alleviate the existing difficulties in that field.

"The operations of an international convention for uniform hours in the mining industry was taken into consideration.

"The disarmament problem was also discussed in connection with the preparation for the meeting of the forthcoming Disarmament Conference. The conversation was throughout of a most cordial character and there was general agreement between the Ministers that the contacts which had been fortuitously established as a result of the meeting at 'The Chateau' in Paris, and in London should be maintained and developed.

Press Interview.

During his interview with the Press yesterday, the questions addressed to the Prime Minister ranged over a wide field.

When asked about the possibility of economic co-operation in Europe, he said that if such union, small or large, developed its productive capacity to the maximum such behind a high tariff wall would neutralise any advantage which industrial agreements might be made. The Government of Europe realised that this was one of the biggest problems of the future, and the beginning of co-operation in solving it were being made at present.

Questioned regarding the drain of gold Mr. MacDonald said that the conception "as safe as the Bank of England" was as true today as 20 or 30 years ago. The Bank of England had always been generous in lending over difficulties in Germany, Austria and Hungary, and when there was a run on short term credits a certain reaction followed in respect of foreign deposits lying in her vaults. For this reason there was some little confidence and demand for gold from London. This will enable new loans to be kept for three or four years without loss of colour or favour.

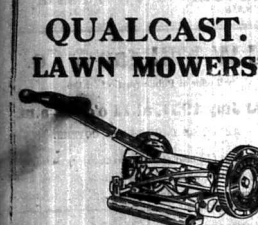

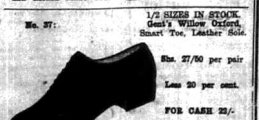
