CRITICISM OF "A PURELY NEGATIVE POLICY."

Development Plans an Urgent Necessity.

INCREASED SETTLEMENT.

Lord Delamere Stresses Urgent Needs of Agriculture.

Lord Delamere Criticized what he described as Government's purely negative policy and urged that if the Colony was to make any progress and most commitments it was essential that adequate consideration should be given to plans of development.

In the opinion of the Elected Members, said Lord Delamere, increased settlement and development in the alienated areas combined with native reserves could alone safeguard the Colony by increasing the population carrying the commitments.

Referring to the importance of starting the Land Bank on a sound basis, the leader of the Elected Members argued that the adequate financing of agriculture was the only thing which would start the wheels turning again.

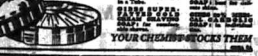

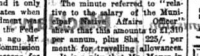

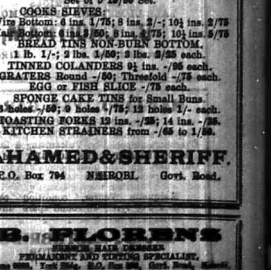

Customs Estimates. A REPLY BY THE COMMISSIONER. The Commissioner of Customs accepted the invitation to give evidence and said he would only deal generally with the main points raised in the details in Select Committee. 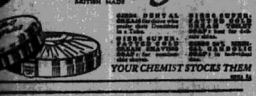

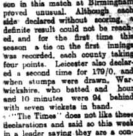
