FURTHER TROUBLE IN THE FAR EAST.

Anti-Japanese Outbreaks in Hong Kong.

MURDERS BY CHINESE BANDITS.

Raiders Derailed the Mukden-Pekin Express.

Following the recent trouble in Manchuria, anti-Japanese demonstrations broke out during the week-end which culminated in the murder of some Japanese residents at Kowloon.

Demons attacks by armed crowds upon Japanese nationals, resulted in the killing of one of the Argyl and Sutherland Highlands, who were eventually compelled to make a bayonet charge upon the mob, in order to prevent a further police station.

The areas of disturbance have been evacuated by Japanese residents who are being given adequate protection at various points. British naval craft are protecting the civilians whereas Japanese ships are alongside.

Chinese bandits derailed the Mukden-Pekin train and killed some 30 people including the driver, fireman and two clerks. Amongst others who were badly injured were an Englishman and a Hindu. The train was also looted.

Belief trains have been despatched to the scene, and Chinese troops are trying to round up the desperadoes.

Crop Which So Far Has Been Neglected.

A GROWING DEMAND.

Despite the wide range of soils, temperature and rainfall conditions in the Highlands, and the probability that the soil conditions are not suitable for the production of onions, large quantities of good quality onions are grown in the Ukamba Province at Nariva, Gitiga and Kisumu, and are exported to the port of Mombasa...

Particulars of the quantities of onions grown in the Colony are available but are so small that they have no influence on the local price of imported supplies.
Detailed figures for quantities of onions imported into the Colony are not prepared, and the quantities and value of imports of onions for the past five years have been as follows—

Wholesale prices for home-grown onions are about 2s. 6d. per cwt. or the quantities offered or sold at the retail price of 1s. 6d. per lb. for imported supplies.

CHINESE INDIGNATION OVER MANCHURIA.

Failure of League to Support Case Against Japan.

FOREIGN MINISTER ATTACKED.

Savage Onslaught by Party of Students.

Indignation has been aroused in China over the failure of the League of Nations to undertake, at the request of China, the appointment of a neutral commission to supervise the Japanese evacuation of Manchuria.

This fury culminated in a savage attack by a party of students upon Dr. C. T. Wang, the Chinese Foreign Minister, who they blamed for failing to persuade the League of Nations to support China's case. He was badly mauled and narrowly escaped a violent death.

His clothes were torn off him, and he was bleeding profusely when members of his staff succeeded in effecting an entrance to his office, where his attack occurred. They kept the attackers of while Dr. Wang was removed.

It is stated that the main Japanese forces have been withdrawn from the railway zone in Manchuria, but railroads of the Chinese railway are guarded and Japanese officials are operating the Chinese lines.

Narrow Escape from Violent Death.

Washing September 29. The Chinese Foreign Minister, Dr. C. T. Wang, was badly injured and narrowly escaped a violent death today at the hands of a mob of students who invaded his office and attacked him with clubs, knives and brass knives in protest of alleged failure to persuade the League of Nations to support the Chinese case in Manchuria.

The students' fury is a significant indication of Chinese indignation that the League has not appointed a neutral commission to supervise the Japanese evacuation of Manchuria.




