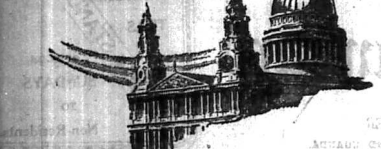

"ON THIS DAY." OCTOBER 29th. Death of Grace Darling, October 29th 1842. The first woman to sail to sea in a lifeboat as that of Grace Darling's was in connection with the wreck of the "Forfarshire" in 1830 on a rocky part of the Firth of Forth. The ship came to grief in a heavy gale at night, which just preceded the dawn. The crew of 29 men were all drowned, leaving the broken wreck miserably exposed to the view of the coast. Miss Williams (Dorothy) from the Long Sand Head, Scotland, was the first to see the wreck, but so fearful was she of the storm that she did not land. The sight of the agonized faces of the crew, however, had more power on her than her fears. She went to the rescue of the ship's doctor and his wife, and was the only one to survive. The news of the shipwreck and the heroic deed of the young girl spread all over the world, and she became a national heroine.

THE BULL TOMES OF EGYPT.
Sacred Burial Sites for Animals.
"THE BULLS REPO."
Models of the recently discovered bull tombs at Amarna, Egypt, and the first complete and scientific accurate models of an Egyptian house, are included in the Egyptian Expedition Society's exhibition, which opened at the Wellcome Historical Medical Museum, London, on September 8. A comprehensive display of ancient Egyptian ornamental and other important things was also shown.

The bull tombs, of which the excavation was completed last season, were the tombs in which the mummies of the sacred Bull-his were buried with the full ritual according to a god. They were well equipped with gold and ornaments. Their life stories being perpetuated in beautiful ornamental reliefs.

One of these tablets relates to a bull which was born in the reign of the first Pharaoh, lived through the stormy period of Cheops, and died when Augustus was Emperor.

A complete case is allotted to the ornate head, one which contained the outer casing of the mummy, and to the glass and obsidian eyes with which the dead bull was provided. 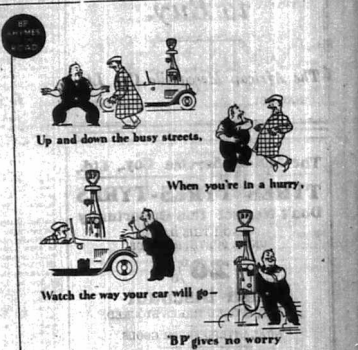

HOPEL PROPRIETORS

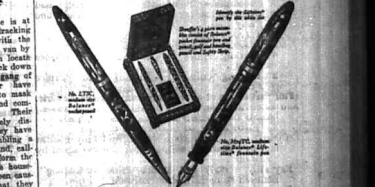

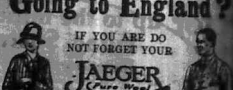
