#### A WATER SECRET.

(From a Special Correspondent). London, (By Mail).

Women's whims are holding up research on malaria, the disease which has been declared an emergency by the Ministry of Health. Dr. P. A. Burton, expert on Tropical Diseases at the Colonial Office, told the Malaria Association: "The female mosquito is wilfully, wayward and flighty. She will not breed when we want her to, so we cannot expect her to do what we propose and deserve what governs their distribution."

What the mosquitoes choose to breed in one pool and leave another may vary even greatly from place to place. If we could discover where the female mosquito would have found the site to commence her nest-making and control the climate, we could easily stop her.

London indicates that the amount of ammonia in the water influences the female mosquito to lay eggs. But there are about 20 species of anopholes which carry malaria and there is no preference for breeding places.

Probably 10 to 12 species of anopholes are found in the United States, and 20 per cent of the malaria of the country is caused by them.

Dr. Burton is working on the problem at the London School of Tropical Medicine. He is also interested in the methods of digging their feed, on behalf of the Empire Marketing Board.

He believes that the malaria fight in Australia is the most important in the world.
