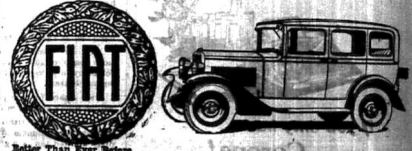

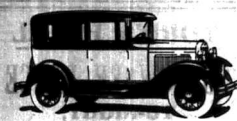

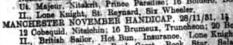

A STRONG AND WELL-BALANCED TEAM.

Preference Given to the Younger Men.

GOOD PRESS RECEPTION.

The Prime Minister has formed his Cabinet and the selection is regarded as constituting a strong and well-balanced team, National in its character and well-equipped to attack successfully the problems it will have to face.

The list consists of 11 Conservatives, 5 Liberals and 4 Labour Ministers. The last-mentioned include Mr. Snowden which strengthens the belief that the late Chancellor of the Exchequer will go to the House of Lords.

The fact that a number of Britain's older statesmen stood aside has been the Prime Minister to have a Cabinet of younger men. The oldest Minister is 67 and the youngest 41.

It is expected from the composition of the Cabinet that the Government will adopt a tenacious policy.

The new Secretary of State for the Colonies is Sir P. Cunliffe-Lister who was President of the Board of Trade in the last National Cabinet.

Tariff Policy Forshadowed.
