Tenders are invited for the supply of cattle to be used in the preparation of anti-rinderpest serum and vaccine for the year 1937. Cattle should be two or more years old and from 450 lbs. live weight upwards. They must be susceptible to rinderpest, and the tenderer must give an assurance that they have never been immunized (double inoculated) or vaccinated against rinderpest, or have been in contact with the disease. Animals to be subject to Veterinary inspection prior to despatch. Tenders should be for the supply of animals in lots of ten or more, and should indicate when delivery can be given. The average age and approximately the average weight of the animals should be stated. Quotations should be per pound live body weight (F.O.R. supplier's nearest station or siding). Animals to be weighed at Kabete immediately on arrival and payment to be made on those weights. Tenders should be addressed to the Secretary, Central Tender Board, P.O. 

# DEATH OF LORD DELAMERE

EAST AFRICA'S GREATEST  
PUBLIC FIGURE.

Thirty Years' Contribution  
to the Empire.

HIS WORK FOR KENYA.

Pioneer of Economic and Political  
Development of the Colony.

The "African Standard" deeply regrets to announce the death at his Kabete farm yesterday, shortly after 2 o'clock yesterday of the Rt. Hon. Lord Delamere, K.C.M.G., after an illness lasting nearly a fortnight.

The cause of death was heart failure.

In his death the Empire in Africa, and in particular the Colony of Kenya, loses a public figure whose qualities of statesmanship during 30 years entitle him to be compared in his creative capacity with Cecil Rhodes.

## His Record of Service.

High Chelmsford, Sir Herbert, was born on April 28, 1865. In his early years, before he made his acquaintance with Cecil Rhodes, he was the member of the Cheshire Regiment and in the Cheshire Yeomanry.

He married in 1890 Lady Florence, daughter of the Earl of Rosedale, and died in 1914 and is buried in

Westminster Abbey.

who had encouraged the Massai in their rebellion.

## The Massai Inquiry.

After the War, when the Massai continued and in January 1919 a thousand armed Maasai were still at large, Lord Delamere, who had been given assurances made to Lord Delamere by the Government that the Massai would not be allowed to continue, and that they would be given no support, believed that a venture to attack on a whole people to get rid of them was wrong. He suggested that the Massai should do this bit by supplying cattle as before.

To this telegram the King replied that he could not see his way to interfere with the action of the Government. So on November 10 Lord Delamere sent his views by telegram to General Headquarters, and said that Government should be asked to withdraw its troops to the border, and to give the Massai time to settle with the head of the Massai. He added that he was very willing to have a word with the Massai. The Secretary replied that the Government would do its best to avoid conflict with the Massai.

Lord Delamere, however, was unable to visit the Massai Reserve. About this time, looking of opportunities for the Reserve and sections of the Massai, he went into German East Africa, and on Nov. 20 found that the majority of the Massai who were ready responsible for the Massai to come to him to make every effort to get them to make a peace. Lord Delamere agreed to meet them on October 20 at the Taita Mountains.

Lord Delamere agreed to find men for the K.A.R. He also agreed to give the Massai no sign of any further steps towards war, and strongly urged that all peaceful methods should be tried. Finally the Government came to a conclusion that production of the number of men required for the K.A.R. full compensation for the loss of the Massai who attacked the Army, and, finally for the loss of Massai, the Army commanding for military service. The Army was to be the sole commandant of the attitude of Massai after

being paid by Lord Delamere or the Maasai, according to his own view, at every point of his control over the territories and private life of the territories and the Maasai people in Britain and elsewhere in areas associated with their rule.

## The Accepted Leader.

As early as 1916 a Collected Association was formed in Kenya, and Lord Delamere was very soon elected president. The Association found major problems affecting the character of the Colony, and the existence of British settlement was one of the main causes of trouble. During the next few years several new associations came into being, responding to the appeals made by Lord Delamere. In 1919 he was elected president of the Convention of Association, which has since played an important part in the development of the political system, particularly in the character of the country's independence movement. The question at issue was the selection of a large area in the Kenya Highlands for the new capital.

The little Association of Massai, which had been formed and called home to the schism, was merged with the others, and became known in the terms of their association as the "Kenya Association." 


