





OF KENYA.**

Question of a League Fix.

The following are extracts from the minutes of a meeting of the Council of the Football Association of Kenya, held at the Club House, Nairobi, on Friday, March 27, 1935, presided over by Mr. T. G. Chisholm, Vice-Chairman, and the Hon. Secretary of the Association.

It was decided that team lists should be handed to the Hon. Secretary of the Association and to the Secretary of the Kenya Football Association, and to him by the Secretary of the Association, and to him by the Hon. Secretary of the Association.

Mr. D. Ross, the Hon. Secretary of the Association, reported that the Board of Management had decided to postpone the meeting at Nairobi, and in the event of his inability to do so, Mr. F. A. Hamood would be elected in his stead.

A League Fix.

Mr. Hamood—For the Goldsmith Cup competition, the question of a "League Fix" was raised.

The "Dobson Cup" competition was postponed until the end of the month (April), and the members of the Sub-Committee agreed to postpone the competition until the end of April.

In conjunction with this, the Sub-Committee appointed a committee to be responsible for the preparation of the rules of the following competitions: the Goldsmith Cup, Dobson Cup and May Cup.

It was agreed that members of the Committee should be entitled to attend the meetings of the following committees: the Goldsmith Cup, Dobson Cup and May Cup.

The question of the date of the Goldsmith Cup competition was referred to the Hon. Secretary of the Association, and other meeting arranged to consider the date.

The Hon. Secretary of the Association, Committee was requested to consider the advisability of holding the Goldsmith Cup competition to be played over five days.

Junior Football Cup.

It was resolved that the rules of this competition be considered by the Hon. Secretary of the Association, and the Director of Education, and any question addressed to him as to whether the competition could be held for school teams.

The Secretary was instructed to send to the Director of Education and the Headmaster of the Head School could be compiled and issued.

Athletic Meeting.

A letter was received from Mr. J. H. Ayre, Friesian cattle breeder, stating that the Inter-Club Athletic meeting, Hon. Secretary, Inter-Club, Nairobi, would be held on the 2nd June, and it was resolved that the date be changed to the 1st June, as the weather was expected to be better.

The Hon. Secretary of the Association was asked to instruct the Hon. Secretary of the Club to consider whether matches should be held on the 1st June.

A letter was read from the Hon. Secretary of the Association, stating that the Club would be holding an athletic meet with clubs in Nairobi, and that the date was to be fixed by the Hon. Secretary.

Also, a letter from Mr. J. W. Kihoro, who was attending a welcome luncheon for Mr. Ayre, advised that he would travel to Nairobi for matches.

The Hon. Secretary was instructed to advise Mr. Ayre accordingly.
