"Colonist" Theory Proved To Be a Failure.

SIR H. LEGGETT'S EVIDENCE.

Protesting that he is a friend of the settlers, with an stesting that he is a friend of the settlers, win an admiration for their struggles and achievement, Sir Humphrey Leggett, Chairman of the B.E.A. Corporation, who was apparently-asked by the Joint Committee to give evidence, condemned the colonisation policy of Kenya as a failure or at the very best a doubtful experiment.

He said the Committee had heard many statements said the committee had heard many statements coloured by local enthusiasm but there had been no attempt to apply the test of figures. Land development must be on a sound basis, strong economically, not requiring subsidies, able to withstand climatic and market vicissitudes and above stand climatic and market vicissitudes and above all able to maintain a high standard of living for Europeans engaged in it and not excessive in its withdrawal of native labour from the needs of the Reserves, if it was to be regarded as a success.

Sir Humphrey submitted that Colonist development was far from being prosperous and self-supporting and his belief was that European settlement—on and his belief was that European settlement— Colonist or plantation lines—was not really essen-tial to native progress—he instanced Uganda and parts of Tanganyika in support atthough adding that settlement, if sound, could be helpful.

He, thought, however that selective plantation development—coffee, sinal, lea sugar and possibly coomits—would be an economic success and the salaried staffs would be unlikely to take any part in politics. 
