AGRICULTURAL CREDIT.

The first session of the new Legislative Council of Kenya was opened in a ceremonial setting on Tuesday.

main business was the administration of the Oath and the Address to Council by His Excellency the Governor of the Colony, Sir Joseph Byrne.

places in Council remain unfilled. In the course of his long address, the Governor, in a review of the financial situation stated that revenue in 1930 fell by £190,000 below the revised estimates and although there were savings amounting to £110,000, the result was a reduction of £50,000 in the surplus balances expectation. These balances at the end of the vear totalled

The estimated revenue for 1931 had been reduced by £231,000 and the considerable surplus which it had been hoped would accrue was not now likely to materialise.

At a time when the country gras fully occupied in conserving its position, His Excellency thought the policy of adding to the surplus balances should be a secondary con-

Aid to Agriculture.

He recalled the agreement on the part of Elected Members that they would support the 1931 estimates if Government agreed to give all necessary assistance to agriculture and explained that assistance given during the last twelve months in advances, sub-sidies, reduced charges by Railways and Harbours, etc., totalled £286,165.

Sir Joseph added that the Secretary of State, with reluctance, had now decided that he would not be justified in agreeing to the release of further sums for agricultural advances. The Secretary of State was also definitely of the opinion that it would be impracticable to transfer these advances by raising a loan and that it might reflect adversely on the Colony's credit.

With reference to the suggestion that there should be a comprehensive enquiry at the present time into the economic structure, the Governor declared that in view of the magnitude and technical character of the task, it would be an ill-advised step to entrust the enquiry to a purely local committee.

He had therefore approached the Secretary of State and anticipated that a Special Com-missioner—a competent and impartial authority with the necessary qualifications— would shortly be invited to undertake the investigation.
