'A representative of the Kenya Sisal Industry is leaving the Colony on Monday, en route for Ireland, to see bars and hessian cloth made from Kenya Sisal.

That is one of the definite preliminary steps in a scheme put forward by a Hairobi firm, Messra. Rosenblum, Bullows and Roy, Léd., to provide £00,000 capital to erect in Nairobi a factory for the manufacture of six million bags a year from local sizal.

The company proposes that the growers should repay the capital by a levy on each ton used by the lac-tory—the levy being credited to the growers in the form of shares. When the capital is repaid the factory will be handed over to the growers.

Government has been asked to agree to the imposition of an anti-dumping protective duty of 25 per cent.




