TOPICS OF THE TURF.

Predominance of Short Distance Races in Kenya.

RECENT EVENTS IN ENGLAND.

(Ancty).

About a year ago I drew attention to the large number of short-distance races run in Kenya, and I stated that in my opinion the racing industry in Kenya and the breeding industry were not well developed. The racing industry of the past year has however shown a decided improvement, and the racing industry is now better developed than ever before. The executive of the Royal Automobile Club, in their annual policy statement, say that "the ideal policy is to develop the industry as a whole, so that the drivers, when programmes are being arranged, will consider the racing frame-ups which have been published in the various papers. The Nairobi September Meeting, in the Nairobi Show Grounds, was a success, and the programme included a race for the most popular horse in England, the Varsity Cup, and a race for the Varsity Cup in Kenya to Cambridge. Those who have won the Varsity Cup over the different distances in England have won the Varsity Cup in Kenya, excepting 1: 10 furlongs, T. 10 furlongs; 1: 6 furlongs, 1: 4 furlongs, 1: 2 furlongs, 1: 1 furlong, 10 furlongs; 1: 6 furlongs; 9: 3 furlongs.

It is interesting to note that the two-year-old race in Kenya is the same as in the short-distance frame-up races run over平衡. It was in the year 1924 that the 1000-yard race was run at Sandown over a field of eight good steers, including Blue Moon, Juddery, Tranquillity, and Soldier. Programmes were run over this distance, with orders not to make the pace too fast, and the race was run in 2:01.12 seconds, and all down the back straight. Tranquillity won with a small lead, just under the wire.

It is evident that the horse must run at a certain pace for it to win. The problem is, what pace? That is the question. If a horse runs at a certain speed, he can run a mile in 2:01.12 seconds, and if he runs at a certain speed, he can run a mile in 2:00.30 seconds.

In France, the short-distance races have been very successful, and in Great Britain they have also been very successful. In Germany, the short-distance races are the only ones which are run in the country. But the problem of getting a good number of horses to run in the short-distance races is a very difficult one.
