## COFFEE IN THE NYANZA PROVINCE.

### Some Observations by the Soil Chemist.

The following observations, based on observations made by the Soil Chemist on certain estates, will be of great interest to all coffee-growers, as other coffee-growers are well aware.

The occurrence of fallowing and disintegration of a soil may be due to various causes, such as two successive years with a heavy rainfall, or to the use of manure containing a large amount of organic acids and nitrogen.

The following evidence for the general statement made that the use of manure has led to a marked increase in the use of phosphate fertilizers is given:

# The Position in Regard to the Defence Force.

## EXPLANATION OF THE NEW REGULATIONS.

### Class I Training Only.

STATEMENT ISSUED BY LORD FRANCIS SCOTT AS COMMANDANT.

In view of the fact that a considerable amount of misunderstanding has arisen, particularly in Nairobi, in regard to the new regulations which have been issued in respect to the Kenya Defence Force, including the command of the Force, I am sending a letter to the "E.A. Standard" explaining the position.

After outlining the syllabus of training, he states that there is no intention of calling out classes other than Class I, except those who wish to help in the training of Class II recruits, and possibly a musketry course.

Although everyone is automatically enrolled, Lord Francis Scott appeals to all members in Nairobi over the age of 20 to remain in their ranks 11 to 14-C, F.S. Modera, with their rank and file.

This is to ensure the complete organization of the older members.

Lord Francis Scott concludes by stating that it is not the intention that Class I men should have to carry out training every year from the age of 18 to 20. When the Class I men become efficient in his training he will be entitled to carry out such lesser training as his District Commandant considers sufficient to keep him up to the required standard.

### An Advanced Class.

The following short typed note which is to the "E.A. Standard" explaining the new regulations under the Kenya Defence Ordinance, has been issued by Lord Francis Scott, Commandant of the Force:

"I have had the pleasure of receiving your very interesting communication concerning the new regulations regarding the conduct of the Defence Force I have had the pleasure of training has lately been issued by the Headquarters, which contains of 60 hours training for Recruits and 371 hours for Officers. These hours are divided among the various units in accordance of two periods of 45 minutes."

"This training is intended for members of Class I only i.e., between the ages of 18 and 20."

"The second class of Recruits would be those members of Class I of the Defence Force who have had previous training, and that of the Advanced Class. This class would consist of men who have had previous O.T.C. training or who have had some or a result prior service in the military branch of the services. They would show aptitude and interest in the military branch of the Advanced Class."

"The third class of Recruits would be those members of Class I who have had previous training time, and those members who have had some training with help in the course of their previous service, beyond an occasional note, some scheme and possibly a
