The Decrease in Customs Revenue. LOCAL PRODUCTION A BIG CONTRIBUTORY FACTOR. Duties on Luxuries.

SO HIGH AS TO PLACE A CHECK ON CONSUMPTION. In an examination of the revenue derived from Customs Duty Lord Moyne points out the adverse effect on this source of revenue caused by the development of local industries.

He adds that a consideration of the revenue derived from certain luxury duties suggests that they are now so high as to check consumption, and that more revenue might be secured by a lower rate of duty.



Britain and the Irish Land Annuities.

IMPORT DUTIES TO MEET DEFAULT IN PAYMENT.

Adopted by the Commons.

FREE STATE GOVERNMENT REFUSES EMPIRE ARBITRATION TRIBUNAL.

The House of Commons by a substantial majority voted for the imposition of import duties, not exceeding 10 per cent, on salmon, on Irish Free State products, in order to recover the loss caused by the default in the payment of the land annuities.

Mr. H. Thomas stated that Mr. de Valera has definitely refused arbitration by an Empire tribunal, and that the British Government was left no alternative but to proceed with the financial resolution imposing the duties.

During the debate it was announced that Mr. de Valera was setting aside the disputed sums pending arbitration matters, but Mr. Thomas insisted that arbitration must be by an Empire Court.

No Alternative.

(THOMAS SPEAKS AS A MEMBER.)

LONDON, July 5.—The House of Commons today rejected the proposal of Mr. de Valera, Secretary for Finance, that the British Government should pay the land annuities, not exceeding 100 per cent, on salmon, on Irish Free State products, in order to recover the loss caused by the default in the payment of the land annuities.
