A MILESTONE IN EAST AFRICAN HISTORY

Peace in Sight in the Cotton Dispute.

SETTLEMENT REACHED ON WAGES QUESTION.

An Outstanding Problem.

NEGOTIATIONS STILL PROCEEDING ON REINSTATEMENT OF STRIKERS.

The settlement of the major issue in the Lancashire cotton dispute has been effected after negotiations lasting for eight days between the representatives of the employers and the operatives.

It has been agreed that the workers' wages will be reduced to Shs. 1/10 per pound, as compared with the employers' original demand of Shs. 2/8, and the operatives' offer of Shs. 1/4.

A general resumption of work is not expected immediately as the employers' organisation has still to meet for the purpose of ratifying the agreement.

There is still one important problem outstanding, namely, the reinstatement of the workers who were already on strike before the general stoppage began. A representative sub-committee is still engaged on this subject, and proposals have been submitted to the operatives' representatives.

Effort to "Clean the Slate."

[TENNESSEE SENATE'S AGENT.] London, Sept. 24.—An asthmatic of the Lancashire cotton operatives' industrial negotiating bodies on each side have approved of a wage reduction of 1/2d. per pound, namely, Shs. 1/8 in the pound.

Eight Days' Negotiations.

The settlement of the wage dispute in the Lancashire cotton industry was reached after eight days of negotiations between the representative of both sides, it was announced yesterday. The operative representative of the side in the still pending question of the reinstatement of strikers, however, has not yet been appointed.

The chairman of the committee of the employers' side, Mr. Leggett, and the Minister of Health, Mr. H. H. Asquith, have continued during the past fortnight to meet the strikers' demands, and the difference was successfully resolved.

It was agreed that the sub-committee will continue until late at night, if necessary, in its efforts to "clean the slate."

A general resumption of work is to begin on September 29 in accordance with the terms of the agreement, to be ratified on September 29 to satisfy the strikers.



1902 - HISTORY OF THE "EAST AFRICAN STANDARD" - 1952

Today's issue of the *East African Standard* has been printed on the first newspaper rotary printing plant ever erected in Eastern Africa. The introduction of this plant marks a big step forward in the newspaper's work in those territories which have a developing press. It is the first time that *The Standard* has undertaken the country where the newspaper has been steadily increasing and where history and progress has been

It is not too much to claim that the *East African Standard* is in every way an important source of the life of East Africa. For it is in its character as a daily paper and has been associated completely with every movement directed at the advancement of East

The *East African Standard* has shared in the prosperity and difficulties which the territories have experienced and it has been through an unceasingly positive attitude towards the growth of business.

The importance associated with the growth of many businesses is always acknowledged by the *Standard*, and it is in this spirit that the business, but the public generally. It was at this point that the first rotary press was introduced, which survived the whole of the machinery and the staff to Nairobi.

The *East African Standard* began the National Library in its building still in existence next to the National Bank of India. It was soon found, however, that the new premises were unsuitable for the purpose

of the small hand which assisted to bring the *East African Standard* into being and it was decided to erect a new building in Sixth Avenue. This building became the home of the present staff. The paper legal as a weekly newspaper containing four pages of news and four pages of advertising.

From the very outset the *East African Standard* set itself the task of doing all it could in its power to promote the progress of the East African Protectorate. Relying upon Sir Charles Eliot's policy of the development of the Highlands by the importation of foreign labour which began in 1902 with the arrival of hundreds of

farmers' associations, the *East African Standard* laid its main policy significant data in this field history. This was the introduction into the advances of white settlement as the backbone of progress. In the early days the pictures, having no voice in the administration of Eastern Africa, the *Standard* was the only newspaper which gave full expression of their views. That policy has continued without deviation down the years and is still the guiding principle of the paper.

A Big Removal.

The paper made rapid progress and had become thoroughly established by 1912 in which year the seat of Government was moved from Mombasa to Nairobi. It was decided, therefore, that the *East African Standard* should be moved to Nairobi.


