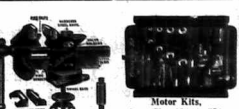

"TAKE-ALL" DISEASE OF WHEAT.

Symptoms and Control Methods.

INFECTED LAND.

The following article on "Take-All" disease of wheat which is prevalent in the Moho and Main Shamba areas, was prepared by the Staff of the Plant Breeding Station at Nairobi.

"Take-All" disease of wheat usually occurs in patches in the field, and shows the wheat to be bleached and stunted, and even not formed, or the empty, old heading on the time of infestation. The appearance of individual plants is very characteristic. The lower apparent thickened and on peeling the lower leaves from the stem, there is formed a black felt of mycelium or less conspicuous hairy lewers or black markings on the lower part of the stem. The roots are noticeably shortened and brittle and have a characteristic woody appearance due to a dense formation of root hairs; a second lot of roots may be formed higher up and also become infested. While these symptoms are usually most conspicuous in the diseased patches in a "take-all" infested field, it is also possible to find individual plants in an otherwise apparently healthy field, with no growth formed in the ears and the symptoms of "take-all" absent from the roots and on the lower part of the stem. Such plants will be the centres from which the disease will spread, giving rise to "take-all" patches if further crops of wheat are grown continually on land which has become infested.

Control Methods.

The fungus (*Ophiobolus graminis*), persists in the soil on grasses and cereals, but cannot remain alive for long in the absence of these hosts. Consequently the disease can be controlled by not growing a cereal crop on infested land for one, or

preferably two years. This means growing some other crop or fallowing the land. In both cases it is most important to realize that there will be little or no benefit to the land if volunteer wheat is allowed to grow, and so far as possible the land must be kept free of green weeds such as "couch," since a few self-seeds of these patches of couch will maintain the disease in the land. Infested land which has been free from hosts of the fungus for one or two years may then be returned to wheat again for a few years. It appears that what will have to be grown in a relation to those districts in the higher altitudes where "take-all" is liable to occur.

The complete eradication of the fungus from "take-all" infested land is a great evil and will not be given for one or two years. Some land should either be fallowed or planted with other crops. The disease is not carried by the spores and so cannot be spread in this way from an infested crop, while the planting of new seed on infested land will not avoid the disease.

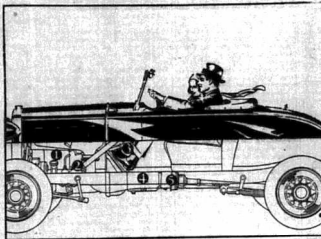

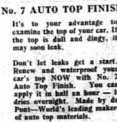

0.33 per cent. The corresponding prices in New Zealand are £10.00 in Canada \$11.00, United Kingdom £10.00, South Africa £10.00, and Australia \$10.00. The prices of granulated sugar in Nairobi varied from 1/10 to 1/12 per lb. The corresponding prices in the United Kingdom are 0.12, in New Zealand 0.21, in Canada \$11.45, in South Africa 1/10, and in Australia 1/12.

The price of locally produced sugar in Nairobi varied from 1/10 to 1/12 per lb. The corresponding prices in the United Kingdom are 0.12, in New Zealand 0.21, in Canada \$11.45, in South Africa 1/10, and in Australia 1/12.

The prices of grain are taken from the Ministry of Labour and the average of the prices in the United Kingdom in August, 1922, with the exception of Canada and New Zealand, whose prices are taken from the Statistical Department of those countries and represent the average of the prices in the United Kingdom in August, 1922. All currency conversions have been made at parity, though the rate of 1/10 of a pound is the official rate of the exchange rate of South Africa in London at 2/4 of a shilling, the value of the Canadian dollar was given as 68.65 cents.

The Index Number for August, 1922, represents a fall of 0.07 per cent. on August 1921; 1.12 per cent. on August 1920; 11.4 per cent. on August 1919; and 15.8 per cent. on August 1918.
