

### HOPES TO BE SPARED "UNLAWFUL AGITATIONS AND DISTURBANCES."

Difficult Financial Position.

OFFICIALS AND NATIVES HELD UP AS EXAMPLE TO OTHERS.

H.E. Sir Stewart Symes intimated in the course of his Budget speech before the Legislative Council of Tanganyika that although the estimates for the nine months of the present year, April to December, showed an honeatly balanced Budget, Government had been compelled to reduce their reserves to vanishing point during the past year

He expressed his belief that the foundation—exports of Africultural produce — although shaken in places remained infact and Government was making efforts to broaden and strengthen it. He declared agricul-ture to be the main and visible source of Tanganylahs'

resort to barter—for example exchange of piece goods for native produce by traders—threatens the whole structure of Tanganyika finance and strong efforts are being made to check this development.

In a reference to the disputed "poll tax" the Governor recognising its unpopularity hoped it would be accepted with the cheerful spirit in which officials had agreed to a levy on their salaries and the phlegmatic acceptance by natives of the more pittances Govern-ment was now able to provide for administrative

Finally he appealed for the maintenance of good temper and hoped Tanganyika might be spared unlawful agitation and disturbance.




