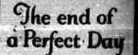

In addition to the estimates already found possible, the increased levy on the salaries of Civil Servants and the proposed additional poll tax, the Petrol Consumption Tax is increased as from yesterday by twenty cents per gallon.

It was stated that indications are that the Customs revenue this year will be £100,000 less than in 1931.

In conclusion the Governor said: "The future is still uncertain, but signs are not wanting in order to advise Government on the necessary legislation and to set up the requisite administrative machinery."

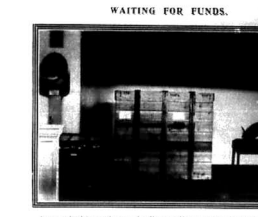

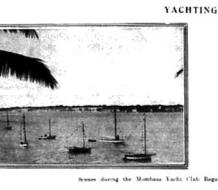

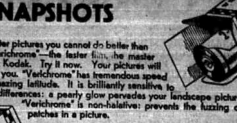
