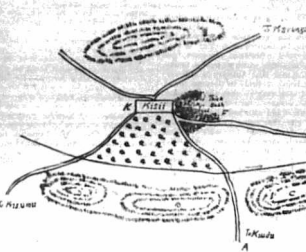

ALLIES' PROGRESS.
London, Thursday.
An eye-witness, at head-quarters, says events from Oct. 9 to 10 had little effect. There has been the usual sporadic shelling doing little harm. The enemy on the night of Oct. 9 made a feint assault, supported by artillery, against their favourite spot on our line. It proved a costly failure. Our guns were used with great effect. This correspondent graphically describes how the British lines were all zig-zag, sometimes from east to west, sometimes from north to south, fitting like potatoes into the enemy's territory. The enemy, with a lavish expenditure of life, never succeeded in driving us back.

A communique says there is no change from the Somme to the Oise. The enemy have been commencing without pushing an infantry attack. We advanced between the Oise and Meuse towards Craonne and north of France.

We have taken many German trenches near Bapaume (east of Rheims). Our troops, after repelling, on the night of Oct. 13, attacks south-east of Verdun, progressed on Oct. 14 south of Verdun on the Metz road. A further communique says that the enemy's offensive movements at Bapaume (on border of Alsace, near Saint Die) have been definitely arrested. The enemy on the night of Oct. 13, attacked the left bank of the Moselle. The situation between La Fresse and the north of Metz is stationary. Our progress at Lens, and between Arras and Albert is notable.

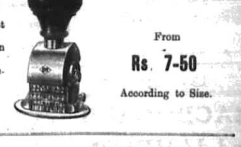

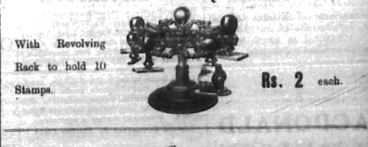
