HOME.
Navy Estimates.
Privileged Cabinet meetings have been held on three successive days. It is believed the members of the Cabinet discussed the business of taxation which has become necessary in order to meet the extra expenditure revealed by the Navy Estimates. It is reported that the details of the Budget will be referred to Sir Edward Grey, Mr. Chamberlain, and Mr. McKenna. These gentlemen met at the Foreign Office and discussed the situation. The "Daily Chronicle" states that the Navy estimate will be in the neighborhood of fifty millions, with supplementary estimate four millions.

SERRANO DISASTERS.
A Virginian passenger steamer named "Morse" was on her way to New York when she collided in a fog with another steamer named "Hendrick." The ships struck a span of six minutes, turning turtle. Twenty-three men were drowned, as well as 14 of the crew. The survivors state that when the vessel hit the span she was in the act of being towed to the pier by a tug.

FINANCIAL.
The Bank of England rate of discount has been reduced from four to three per cent. after only a week's intention following on next week's alteration in the rate.

Following the recent business on the Stock Exchange and the lowering of the Bank Rate to-day, a boom has been created in gilt-edged stock. Since the beginning of the year considerable advances have taken place. Irish land stock has advanced 95. Indian stock to 91. and leading house railings to 91.

The boom in investment securities continues and new loan issues are becoming everyday occurrences.

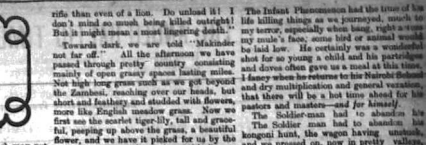

Your Chamber was requested by His Excellency the Governor, through the Honourable the Provincial Commissioner, Mombasa, to nominate Members for the Sites Board and for the Licensing Board which was done.

Your opinion was also asked, and given, as to the suitability of the present ground for the new Post Office, Mombasa.

A very important meeting of your Chamber took place at Kilindiini, on 6th June 1913, to meet and discuss with the Chairman of the Land Department, the subject of the proposed new gowden sites at Kilindiini.

Five Insurance on the Proposed Gowdens at Kilindiini.

At the request of the Honourable the General Manager, Uganda Railway, your Chamber took up the question of the Insurance on these proposed buildings; and various have been received from the London Chamber of the Land Department, and various Insurance Companies in London, all of which have been placed at the disposal of the General Manager, for final action when the time comes.

THE PROPOSED CHANGE IN CURRENCY.

The best thinks of your Chamber are due to the Managers of the National Bank of India Limited, and the Standard Bank of South Africa Limited, Mombasa, for the interesting manner in which they dealt with this subject.

COAST REPRESENTATION ON THE LEGISLATIVE COUNCIL.

At a meeting of your Chamber in August last, the following resolution was unanimously adopted—

"The Honourable Mr. J. H. Wilson, commands the confidence of this Chamber and we consider it our duty to recommend to our members that he be nominated to represent the Coast on the Legislative Council."

It would be no exaggeration to say that I have no less pleasure in concurring with you in this opportunity to express my great appreciation for the support accorded me by the Chamber at this meeting.

PROPOSED MUNICIPAL COMMITTEE.

At the request of the Honourable the Provincial Commissioner, Mombasa, in October last, your Chamber appointed a Committee to confer with the Honourable the Provincial Commissioner, as to the advisability of a Municipality being formed for Mombasa.

This Committee have held several meetings, but are not yet in a position to report to the Chamber, but intend to do so at an early date. I trust their deliberations and opinions will be of value and assistance to your Chamber, in the work before them.

CUSTOMS DUTY—UGANDA PROTECTION.

A Committee from your Chamber met the Representative sent here by the Uganda Government, the Honourable the Chief of Customs, Mombasa, who is now in Town.

To this Committee your unalloyed praise is due for the able and constructive reports made by them, and I have no doubts but that it will bear considerable weight when the Colonial Secretary arrives here this decision.

I am glad to see that the Nairobi Chamber of Commerce are in complete accord with us in this matter.

HANDLING OF GOODS—UGANDA RAILWAY.

Your Chamber invited the Honourable, the General Manager, Uganda Railway, to meet them in order to discuss the question of damage to goods from ship to shore, the handling of goods at Kilindiini, and the Uganda Railway.

This meeting stands adjourned, pending a suitable time for further discussion, when the "planning of responsibility" will be specially dealt with.

BAZAAR FINANCE.

On two occasions this matter of Bazaar Finance was debated, but nothing of a definite nature was considered feasible at the present time.

While we are all agreed that any recommendations from the Chamber on the question of the "system of credit" must have weight, I feel strongly that the various firms interested in the bazaar must be allowed to make what arrangements they deem satisfactory to themselves.

MOMBASA TROLLEY LINES. Your Chamber passed a resolution in favour of these lines, and is taking up at the earliest possible date.

It must be remembered that the Chamber

HOME.
Naval Supremacy.
 A large and representative meeting of the Government was held on Monday in the official hall, when a resolution among the members of the support of the commercial community as well as the military and naval authorities, was adopted, strongly endorsing the Government's policy in the matter of the Navy. The speakers emphasized that there could be no safer economy than to refuse funds for the adequate defence of the country.

A Land Short.
 Lord Dufferin, in a recent speech, objected to a secret land commission valuation of the estate at Boddle, Liverpool, at £20,000,000. He offered to sell it for the sum named, and Harold Dorman, M.P., has now written accepting the terms, subject to certain conditions.

Wanted: Incarceration.
 The suffragettes greeted the arrival of Mr. Lloyd George in Glasgow with an outburst of violence. The women of the Castle near Crif was found to be on fire and the drawing-room with many valuable pictures and furniture destroyed. The note of warm welcome to Mr. Lloyd George was found in the house of Sir William belonging to the husband of an ex-prisoner of the anti-suffragettes who had been found. Another house about a mile distant from Abercrombie Castle was destroyed by the same party.

The British Consul.
 Sir Edward Grey in the course of the speech referred to the complaints against his service. He described the extent and variety of the work accomplished by consuls, which were performed with great regularity and ability. The consuls and the Foreign Office were co-operating closely for the purpose of disseminating information interesting to British traders and industries.

Hope for Ulster.
 Herald states that the momentous statement of Mr. Asquith on Tuesday in the Commons may completely change the political situation in Ulster. A concession was announced of the most sweeping description, covering everything but actual secession.

Mr. Lloyd-George and Mr. Churchill.

The Commercial Union Assurance Company.

British Trade.

The principal decrease in imports comprised—new cotton yarn of £1,053,341, wool of £700,774, and other goods of £1,171,285. Total value of exports for the month of January was £2,215,000, and that of imports £2,215,000.

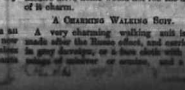
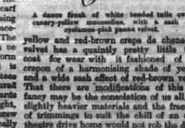

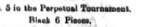

ROSTHRUM
British Sports
Our Weekly Letter on European Sports and Pastimes.

LONDON, January 16.
A meeting was held in London last evening which was of very great importance. The positions concerned were shown as the "British" Special Committee, formed for the purpose of collecting money to be expended on the development of athletic talent in the way of the Olympic Games. The Committee, asked for £100,000, but how little the English public cares about the athletic prestige of the nation is shown by the contributions to the fund only amounting to £15,000. Of this about £2,500 has been spent, or promised in grants, and the balance will be handed over to the British Olympic Council or returned to the giver. We shall not know when the policy will be followed until after the next meeting of the Council on January 16th, but the first is the most likely.

ATHLETICS.
As pointed out long ago in these columns, England cannot hope to be the athletic home in our day. No real progress has been made since the 1912 games, but there are signs that the authorities recognize or understand the requirements. It is really so simple, as far as recognition of what should be done, but another matter. We need a large and influential British Olympic Committee, who will undertake missionary work by striving to induce the Secondary and Public Schools, Colleges and Universities to take up athletics seriously. The next step is to provide the young athletes with real coaches (amateur or professional). The formation of Inter-collegiate and Inter-university Athletic Associations must also be known about. With these things accomplished, we might develop finished athletes in our time for a great extent. It is rare to see an athlete who knows how to run, whilst as to the field events men, we would have to send men to study methods in the United States for six months, and then to send men to England for the purpose of studying football, and then to send men to be away learning from others. What will happen cannot be seen for the moment, but the outlook for 1914 is decidedly bad.

A GREAT WORKER.
England has lost a great worker in the cause of real amateur athletics through the death of Charles Val Hunter. His keen criticism on Committees and in the Press has led to the removal of many abuses and the introduction of several desirable reforms. The deceased was particularly distinguished as the leading Metropolitan athlete for the purpose of attending county sports meetings and for his constant "visiting" athletes. The famous Holdenfield festival was his masterpiece, and for these outings and many American and Colonial athletes will have permanent recollections of the social functions at the George Hotel after the sports, and the drive there. The Festival means that the Metropolitan was considered a wonderful play of a runner's form, and for anyone to better him in this respect was a great feat.

THE BOXING BOOM.
We are enjoying a wonderful boom in boxing and it ought to do a lot of good. We are requiring more and more to develop the fighting spirit, and to all-end the effects of those who are not only men, but who would rather swallow any man than fight. We need to encourage every movement and practice which is directly self-control, the ability to smother, and to have aggressiveness, and above all the spirit which refuses to recognize defeat.
