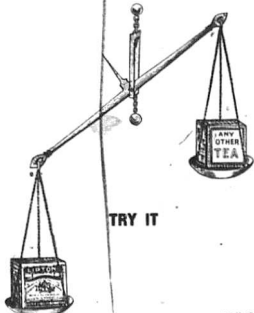

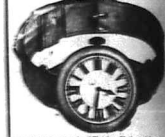

PATRIOTIC DEMONSTRATIONS

During the course of the proceedings, the Duma frequently cheered the Tsar, the French and Japanese Ambassadors.

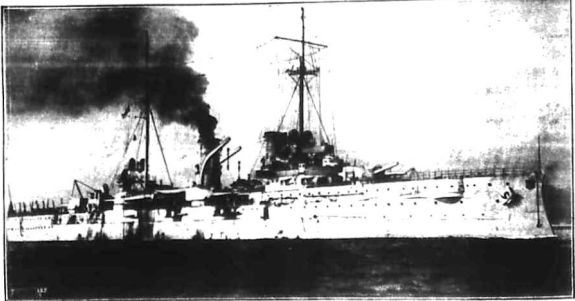

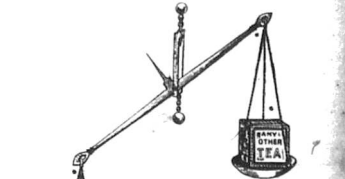

**CASE FOR BREACH OF CONTRACT.**

Standard P. & P. Works v. J. Coles.

**MAGISTRATES JUDGMENT.**

Judgment in the case for breach of contract brought by the Standard P. & P. Works against J. Coles was given by the Town Magistrate, Mr. McMillan, on Tuesday morning. In view of the vital interest of the case to employers of European labour on contract, we reproduce in full the judgment, which is as follows:—

In this case the Plaintiff is suing for Ks. 750 as damages for breach of contract. The Plaintiff is the proprietor of a printing and publishing business in Nairobi and the case is that they engaged the Defendant as workmen for three years; that he in fact worked for them for a little over a year only, and that they are entitled to the damages claimed for his breach of contract on leaving, their employment before his agreement had expired. The Defendant's case is that he had no agreement with Plaintiff to work for three years, and that he was justified in leaving their employment by a notice which the Plaintiff's posted in their works to the terms of which I shall refer later. The first issue is, was there a three years' agreement? The Plaintiff only on the first letter written by their manager, Mr. Thry to the Defendant, offering him the job, and to a cable received from the Plaintiff accepting the offer. The first letter is dated May 13, 1912, and the other stating that they are now having a vacancy and setting out the nature of the work, it goes as follows:—

"We are prepared to offer you an agreement which will be for three years, at a monthly salary of Ks. 100. The term of the agreement will be on specially advantageous conditions as that of the 'Times of India', particulars of which we give are known to you. For further particulars as to conditions of work, please apply to Mr. Thry, Nairobi, on or before May 30, 1912, as the Plaintiff, were acute, definitely offering the Defendant the position, and asking him to make it as accepted if the Defendant

lashed 'Yes.' It has been suggested that the Defendant was, but in any event, it is right in accordance with the Plaintiff's affidavit that he did accept the offer contained in the Plaintiff's letter.

It is understood that the Defendant came out to this country; that his passage money was paid by the Plaintiff, and that he in fact worked for the Plaintiff for over a year. Under these circumstances I think it is perfectly fair for the Defendant to say that there was no agreement and that he could have had any time on a month's notice. It is true that the Defendant did not receive the written agreement to which he was referred, but I think it is quite clear that there was a definite three years agreement between the parties, the terms of which are set out in the letters I have referred to, and by which both parties were bound until such time as the formal written agreement was drawn up and signed.

Paragraphs three and four of the Plaintiff's affidavit show that the Plaintiff had posted the following notice in their works:—

"Due to the European crisis, the proprietors of the 'East African Standard' are obliged to give the whole staff one month's notice to leave, dated from January 1, 1914.

"This does not mean that any of the employees will have to leave the service of the firm, it only signifies that we intend to re-organise the firm in case they cannot see their way to continue to work on the same terms as the present staff.

"Until this notice is revoked, everybody must consider himself under notice, even if his services are not dispensed with on September 30.

"I have had that there was an agreement between the parties and it therefore follows that this notice could not possibly apply to the Defendant as the Plaintiff has not withdrawn to dismiss him on a month's notice. However, the Defendant has admitted in cross-examination that he applied for his present position in Uganda before this notice was in fact published, and it does not believe that he left on the day of it. The Defendant has stated that he had an interview with the Plaintiff, Mayer, in Nairobi, who had asked for his increase of salary and that Mayer refused to grant it to him because he had no written agreement. Mayer claims that this interview never took place. Mr. Thry, the manager of the Plaintiff, has admitted that this interview never took place. Mr. Thry, the manager of the Plaintiff, has not stopped from saying that there was an agreement. This defence was not pleaded. In any event I am not prepared, on the evidence before me to say that it is

justified by the fact. I hold on the second issue that the Defendant has broken his agreement and that there was no justification for his doing so. I award to the Plaintiff claim, in the first place, Ks. 500, the amount of the Defendant's passage money, and secondly Ks. 250 for the general loss and inconvenience they have been put to. I think Ks. 500 is a reasonable amount to claim for the Defendant's passage and I think that the Plaintiff are entitled to receive it as damages, even if there was no special clause in the contract dealing with it.

With regard to the Ks. 250, claimed as general damages, I also think that is a moderate claim, considering the inconvenience which the Defendant must have caused.

In my opinion the Defendant's real reason for leaving the Plaintiff was that he had obtained a better job elsewhere, and under these circumstances I do not think it is right to say anything whatever.
