Fighting Over Austrian Border.

ENEMY FALLING BACK.

[TELEGRAPHIC REUTER'S AGENCY]

Rome, May 21.—The "Messaggero" states that, after the meeting of the Senate, the cabinet will meet and probably draw up a formal declaration of war against Austria.

Rome, May 21.—The Austrian military authorities on the Italian seas back the Italian mails, arrested the rails, and broke the railway telegraphic communication.

The Senate by 202 votes to 2 passed the bill granting the Government extraordinary powers, amidst scenes of enthusiasm.

Rome, May 21.—From Amsterdam it is reported that the Italian Ambassador in Berlin was mobbed when leaving the embassy on Thursday evening, his hat being knocked off. The assailant was arrested. The Imperial Chancellor and Foreign Secretary immediately apologized.

Austria's note to Italy emphasizes her readiness to make concessions throughout the negotiations, but refuses to recognize Italy's denunciation of the Triple Alliance treaty, which runs on to 1920, and charges Italy with all responsibility for the consequences of her present action.

Rome, May 21.—It is reported that the Cabinet has drafted the declaration of war.

A state of war, from May 28, has been declared in the northern provinces of Italy, at the islands and communes of the Adriatic coast and also in the fortresses.

The "Gazzetta d'Italia" reports a fresh success after Italian chasseurs and an Austrian patrol, in Brescia. The patrol entered Italian territory, and was attacked

and vigorously pursued by the chasseurs. No details are to hand.

London, May 23.—It is reported that the Italian forces are mobilized.

London, May 24.—A cable dated May 24 at 1:20 a.m. announces that Italy has declared war on Austria.

Telegrams from Rome state that Italy will send eighty Austrians and German steamers in Italian ports of the value of four millions sterling.

Rome, May 24.—It is officially stated that Austrian aeroplanes attacked the arsenal at Venice, in the early morning, but were speedily driven off. Aeroplanes also attacked Porto Corsini, near Ravenna, and Ancona, but were driven off by Italian aircraft. An Austrian scouting ship and destroyers attacked Barfizza, but were repulsed by an Italian ship and torpedo-boat. Argents, at Porto Corsini bombarded the enemy's aeroplanes which were also attacked by an Italian aeroplane and dirigible. The enemy's objectives at Ancona was the railway, which was slightly damaged. The enemy unsuccessfully attempted to drop bombs on the airship shed at Jesi.

Italian destroyers entered Porto Buso, a small island near the frontier, where they destroyed the quay and sank a number of motor-launches, bringing off 47 prisoners. There were two aeroplanes in the attack on the Venice arsenal. They dropped eleven bombs, but no serious damage was done.

Amsterdam, May 24.—An official German note says that Italy, by a provocative attack on Austria, has also broken the alliance with Germany. The Austro-German alliance, welded by the ownership of arms, will remain uninjured by Italy's desertion to the enemy. The German ambassador has been ordered to leave Rome with the Austrian ambassador.

The Italian declaration of war presented at Vienna recalls Italy's denunciation of the Triple Alliance, following Austria's violation of the alliance. It says that Italy cannot fail to be her duty to take, against every existing and future menace, the

necessary measures for the fulfillment of her national aspirations. Therefore, she considers herself to be in a state of war from May 24.

London, May 25.—The Kaiser has left Glatz for the West. It is believed that he is going to the Italian front.

Reuter's correspondent at Rome says it is announced, in accordance with the Hague Convention, that enemy merchantmen will be returned on the conclusion of peace.

German, Austrian, Bavarian, and Prussian ambassadors and ministers at the Quirinal and Vatican have left Rome.

Berlin, May 25.—Italy, Austria, and Germany announce that they will rigorously observe Swiss neutrality.

Rome, May 25.—An Italian communique states that, on the frontier, in Carnia, Austrian artillery bombarded our position unsuccessfully. Our artillery then cannonaded the enemy's gun positions. We advanced everywhere along the frontier, in the region of Friuli, into the enemy's territory, encountering feeble resistance. We occupied Caporetta, Cormons, Versa, Cervignano-Terzo, and the heights between the Idre and Isonzo. The enemy retreated, destroying bridges and burning houses.

Amsterdam, May 25.—Italy's decision to join the Allies has caused a marked change in the attitude of Germany towards the American note. Germany is willing to make a great concession in order to conciliate the United States, and avoid trouble.

London, May 25.—The "Times" correspondent at Campo Tizzoni, says an action occurred on May 24, at Col del Tonale, twenty miles to the east of Tirano. The Italians repulsed the Austrians, who had, apparently, entered Italy, and captured several hundred Austrian Alpine troops.

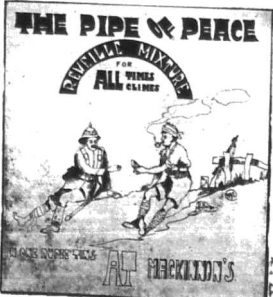

BRITISH PRISONERS.

Revelations of German Barbarity

A most important White Paper, giving ample facilities as to the treatment of prisoners in Germany and in its colonies, in the form of a correspondence between the British Majesty's Government and the United States Ambassador at Berlin (Daily Mail). The correspondence covers over 1500 pages, and is highly interesting. 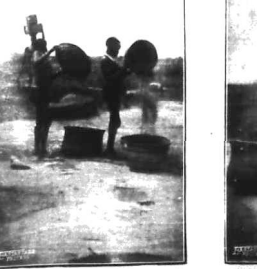

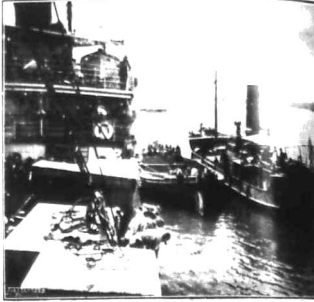
