## ENEMY TIGHTLY HELD.

[THROUGH REUTER'S AGENCEY.]

London, Aug. 8.  
Reuter's correspondent in Amsterdam says that a Vienna communiqué states that a peace offer to Russia last through the King of Denmark. The war by Russia is stated that there is no question of peace discussions.

Amsterdam, Aug. 8.  
Further particulars about Warsaw are given in to-night's Berlin communiqué, which says that after the Russians repelled from the outer and inner fortifications without damage to themselves they retired to Praga, a suburb of Warsaw, and held the town until the Russians evidently attacked again.

The Germans also make the same claim, but mention fighting at several points between the frontiers and the battle of Gorlitz. It seems that Germans invaded Silesia again, and then Russian attacks on the Narew and also in the southeast on the war.

London, Aug. 8.  
A Petrograd communiqué reports that Germans were repelled in the attack between the Prusia and the Narew, and the situation unchanged. Desperate fighting took place all Wednesday and Thursday on the left bank of the Narew, and on Saturday morning the Germans had reached Ostrava. A series of vigorous Russian counter-attacks were upheld along the enemy's front at a distance of six miles from the river. The Russians captured a few hundred prisoners. Fighting continues here, but all is local, and a number of prisoners.

Related actions occurred on Sunday on the left bank of the Narew, particularly in the direction of Lomza and to the north of Lomza on the Ostrow road.

London, Aug. 8.  
Reuter's Amsterdam correspondent says that troops of the 1st division, Schleswig-Holstein, were made to the enemy's front. The attempt was only a limited advance across the districts between Warsaw and Tczew. Several battles took place in the fifth between the Vistula and the Bug. These were contested, but the Germans were driven back little towards the north.

An Austrian communiqué notes that German artillery fired on the whole front. London, Aug. 8.  
A communiqué issued in Petrograd says that the Germans are attacking the fortresses of Kowno and Kovno, and a point of intense fire. Following the launching of a huge gas shell, the Germans made a dash on Kovno, at dawn on Friday morning, and carried the walls near Sventoji, but the Russian fire and counter-attack dislodged them everywhere.

Desperate fighting is proceeding in the Narva front, the enemy, and the Russians, making a little progress along the roads from Olsztynek to Eydtkau.

The enemy delivered a desperate attack on Thursday evening in the region of Sventoji, but were repulsed.

Hand fighting continued between the Vistula and the Bug.

London, Aug. 9.  
An official statement issued in Petrograd says, in the direction of Riga, and elsewhere the enemy from the region between the rivers Irvin and Dvinsk, having driven the Germans back from the Siedlce district to

a position further south, and continued to press the retreating enemy on the front from Dvinsk to Poniatow, having driven some of their detachments out of positions at the point of the bayonet.

Severe fighting has also taken place on the roads from Vieppi to Lukow and Vladava, and also on the roads from Chodin, where German attacks have been repulsed.

## ITALIAN FRONT.

## Alpine Troops' Feat.

## STEADY PROGRESS.

[THROUGH REUTER'S AGENCEY.]

London, Aug. 8.  
Reuter's correspondent in Rome says that the Italian offensive is being vigorously maintained. In various sectors, the Austrians delivered a series of counter-attacks on the Italian centre in the Carso plateau, hoping to arrest the advance. A communiqué says that the Italians withstood the shock, and they attacked the enemy fiercely, storming a more extensive entrenchment, which dominated an important road, and a vital height. The enemy yesterday evening made most desperate efforts to break the entrenchment, but were completely repulsed.

London, Aug. 8.  
A Rome communiqué states that nothing important occurred on any front, but the Italians progressed somewhat on the Carso plateau taking 100 prisoners. An Italian airship bombed a camp around Lake Idro, while another airship bombarded Ossola, and a third, which was returning, was attacked by an Austrian seaplane which dropped incendiary bombs from above. The airships opened fire on the seaplane which took flight, and both airships returned undamaged.

London, Aug. 8.  
Reuter's correspondent in Rome says that the battle on the Carso front was still of a most stubborn nature yesterday, but during the evening the Italians made considerable progress, taking a large number of prisoners.

A communiqué reports that the Austrian artillery fired incendiary shells on the Monfalcone dockyard, causing a great fire, and then attempted by a curtain of shrapnel, to prevent the Italians from extinguishing it. The fire, however, was soon put under control.

London, Aug. 9.  
A telegram from Rome states that both the Italians and Austrians have shown facility in inventing expedients for warfare in the way of surprise attacks.

A communiqué records that during the night of Saturday, the 12th, a different form of rocks towering above Vallesimonte, and surprised, at dawn on Saturday, some Austrians who were entrenched near Eravalle peak, capturing many horses and other material, hastily abandoned in the trenches. On the same day, another force of the enemy attempted to go to the north-east of Eravalle, but was driven from the heights by the fire from machine guns, which were hoisted to a height of 10,000 feet to the Eravalle necks.

The Italians in Cadore, after several days' artillery preparation, successfully advanced along the Sexten valley, driving the enemy back and reaching a front extending from Martell to Breglio.

The enemy on the Carso plateau is endeavouring to the strongest plateau, to impede the Italian approach works, and is constantly delivering attacks, even attempting to place movable wire entanglements in front of the Italian lines.




