and Mr. Marsden it will be gathered that the Administration is in full sympathy with a Chamber of Commerce, but not a Chamber of usurers. The presentation of Commercial interests by the Mombasa Chamber is today, we have already pointed out, a matter of which merchants, who are holding aloof from membership, that they are more to blame than the present members for the unsatisfactory state of the Chamber's affairs. When the Chamber was started three years ago, all European merchants were invited to assist in forming a Chamber. Had all joined, the Chamber there would never have been any question of the Indian merchant community having a predominant vote as the number of Indian representatives would have been limited by unanimous and mutual consent, when however the Indian merchant met that many European merchants held aloof, they naturally admitted a larger number of their own community to membership otherwise the financial position of the Chamber would have been an unresolvable one.

Three years have passed and a determined effort will be made to create a unity between the various merchant communities. It is felt that amongst the European merchants and the Indian merchants that the European merchants should be in a majority on commercial questions as they undoubtedly hold very much larger interests in the country than any other community and we do not believe the Indian merchants will do otherwise, provided they have a fairly substantial voice on all matters of importance. They will be heard and have every right to be heard and we have never found any European merchant disputing this right.

The difficulties expressed in our article of August 19th still exist, but they are to be treated unresolvably. The Mombasa Chamber of Commerce is an existing body, duly constituted by the British Government, it is therefore quite impossible to alter this fact. The constitution, however, of the Chamber is in question, and may be altered as to arrive at a situation a much desired both by the Administration and the Trade Committee of the Capital. The constitution can be so arranged that the Chamber's actions are limited to a committee composed of European members of the Chamber or elected by the whole body and say 7 Indian merchants each representing one sect of the various communities. We are of the opinion this would satisfy all parties and it would further enable the business of the Chamber to be discussed in the English language, which is well understood by the leading Indian merchants. The present method of interpreting and discussion in various tongues causes delay in the Chamber's business and is a seriously good attention.

DEARTH OF LABOUR
IN G. E. A.
PROGRESS OF RAILWAY
RETARDED.
Contractors ask for Chinese Labour.

Great difficulty is being experienced in obtaining labour for the excavations in connection with the Railway in course of construction in German East Africa. The difficulty is due to the fact that there is some indirect influence on the attitude of the natives in this connection, a provision of hostilities on the part of the natives, who have displayed a sincere desire for work, and no trouble was experienced in getting the necessary number of men.

The security at present is of such a formidable nature that the contractors have found it necessary to have recourse to extreme measures, and have gone to the length of petitioning the Governor of German East Africa for permission to import Chinese Labour into the country. They stated that severe restrictions would be imposed on these men, similar to those which are in force in South Africa relating to imported labour. The Governor in his reply rejected the proposal of labour, but allowed the petitioners to present a plea which he could not entertain their request.
