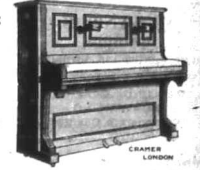

The German was then taken to the hospital and died.

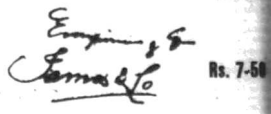

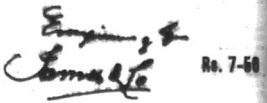

WHAT AMERICA IS THINKING.

IMPRESSIONS OF AN UNPREJUDICED EYE-WITNESS.

MANY ILLUSIONS DISPELLED

By JEROME K. JEROME

(Mr. Jerome K. Jerome is now in America, where he is popularly known as a writer and as a lecturer. Furnishes him with an exceptional opportunity of obtaining first-hand impressions upon the attitude of the American nation to the war. He is writing for The East African Standard several articles in this important position.)

I have been told that America has had headlined, materialize America had used for Scraps of Paper that strenuous push for American harbored suspicion that for practical purposes might be in sight. The American public had been told that America looking at all questions from a business point of view, her exports and imports, and it is not surprising that she was generally indignant at the war, which was at once only that she would be should and quickly and was not particularly concerned with who should come out on top.

I had been told that America, with its prevalent bias to the English language, and with a German accent, was inclined to look down with a philippic air upon the European nations, to each other or through the eyes of a person who had been to America.

I had not been six hours at sea before I found that I had been misinformed. I do not find sitting next to me at dinner a typical New England dame who might have stepped out from the pages of Mrs. Wilkins, asked me if I thought "We should win." She spoke of the bad luck of some friends of hers who had in their possession a collection of American flags, and I told her that I had seen one.

THE AMERICAN CORRESPONDENT.
The most interesting point I heard about of the war in America was that several of the United States officials who had been sent out to the Tennessee to see how the war was going, returned to their homes with a different opinion rather than the general opinion of a correspondent, and that of being about in the rear with little to do, and collecting gossip from bewildered peasants. One of these appeared to have been more successful than his fellows. He told me that his place had been to dress very smartly and assume a superior manner. Stopped at the rear line, and he would ask for the staff with the air of being himself the Minister of War. As often as not he would be passed through. As a precaution against over-enthusiasm, some officers, he would fill the dispatch case with all the latest French newspapers he could collect. He would leave them douring its contents and stroll on.

He claimed to have followed the British army from Mons. The Germans had concentrated all their efforts upon it, and von Kluck's staff had persuaded themselves that it was out of the fighting. That it came back again with the miracle of the war. It was that, and that alone, that saved Paris. It ran up again like a man from the dead. It sprang out from its grave, as it seemed to the Germans, and stood between them and Paris. I am going only this gentleman's impressions.

AMERICAN HOPES AND FEARS.
I found that the fear of all these Americans who, from their knowledge, told me of the enormous number of German submarines, was that the British people might be underestimating the forces up against them. They had not seen our beds against through the hot day, outside the working offices. They had not seen every space in our towns crowded with the hands of drilling men. Their anxiety was that we might not be grasping the stupendous nature of the struggle in front of us. That their hope, however, they were well off, they could be no doubt.

One delightful fellow that I chatted with was the proprietor of a quick-firing gun which he had succeeded in selling to the Belgians. He was highly pleased with its success. Properly handled, and with opportunity, it can be worked for sixty hours at a stretch, moving down its run without interruption. A picturesque account of the slaughter it had accomplished in one battle he had telegraphed from Belgium to his

firm in America. It had so open the interests of the gun, a mild and humane gentleman had made that he had shot himself up in his own case to get to know it, and the progress of the gun making a cool bet on for the second.

AN UNPREJUDICED WITNESS.

Just quote the most interesting man on board to me was a United States official who had been all through Belgium, attached to the German General Staff. One regret that some of the English papers, to the expression of the real state of things, afforded them a good deal of unnecessary satisfaction. This gentleman had been asked by the German authorities to inquire as an unprejudiced witness into the stories of atrocities alleged against the German army. A large number—of the kind with which the history of war in all countries is full at all times has made an incident—the war was running on steadily, the village would come in fanned and mad with thirst. Beer was their first thought, but that soon ran out, and then, both men and officers. What happened there, their thirst with eating Burgundy or falling that with sports. What quipped afterwards through long nights as he is liable to dwell on. The fate of hundreds of Belgian women from 14 to 18, and women of 20, from 21 onwards to devote to the maintenance of the American Red Cross in a Belgian family, were now dying in a hospital, and one of the men, a doctor, who was attending from late in the afternoon of one day to three o'clock in the morning of the next. The gentleman has the name of the doctor, and the name of the hospital. It is one of the things that were reported, the cutting off of feet and hands, he failed to find proved and did not credit.

That women and children were marched in front of the troops he found was done when the Germans were entering a village. It was used as a precaution against sniping from windows and was generally successful. He thought that they would have been hated looking their own lives lowered their guns from their shoulders at sight of these pleading agonized eyes.

PREDOMINATED BRUTALITY.
Generally speaking, he had come to the conclusion that the German army had acted with predominated brutality for the express purpose of intimidating the inhabitants, but individually the average German soldier was just a man. That this attitude had served its purpose was unfortunately a fact. The Belgian army had been hampered in its operations by friendly appeals from the "black" arts of towns and villages, who clattered that the fighting should take place in any other neighbourhood but their own.

At first he had doubted the younger German officers, and only a few ideas in their head the triumphant march of the German armies east and west through Europe. But before he had left Belgium a change had taken place. A possibility of German defeat was creeping in. "You it may," some day he would be told, but you shall make a death struggle. Germany will neither be victorious nor dead."

The German people and the German military staff must not be confused. To the soldier, death in a battle means the end of all things. Von Bernhardt, in his book, severely takes Schiller to task for saying that German greatness depends neither upon German Kaiser nor upon German army, that while the German Crown goes down in battle the German people, unconquered, will live on. But what I gathered from these men, who have been through Germany, who have lived in the German military atmosphere, was that the only road to lasting peace lies through the utter and complete crushing of German militarism. A peace before that has been and would merely mean fever and war.
