



In to-day's issue we give further extracts from the Report of the Land Committee in which the question of Land in Mombasa is reported. As the report says, Government have only 770 acres of land in Mombasa out of 3,400 and that the titles of nost of the balance of the laud name, by that held outside of the Govern-ment, is without really sound titles and the difficulty of fixing titles

is getting greater every day.

There is not a siggle residence of any consequence free to let in Mombasa, to-day, and the Land Speculators who obtained their land, practically for nothing, are asking such ridiculous prices that it would be impossible to purchase and build a dwelling which could be let under at least £1(x) per annum, a rent which only the more wealthy classes of the European inhabitants of the Island could afford to pay. To ease the situation which is becoming desperate, H. M. Commissioner should allow say 100 to 200 acres of crown lands, (already completely surveyed and charted) to be offered to the Public, the balance to be retained until the whole ordinance survey is finished. This would have a twofold result. Firstly, it would allow of the natural expansion of Mombasa township. Secondly, it would week the clique of speculators who are taking an unfair advantage of the impossibility of Settlers obtaining any Crown Land on which to erect a dwelling, shops or other buildings, which they may need in order to earn a living.

It would be interesting to ascertain how far our Crown Advocate could justify the rule in the Colonial Office Regulations against Officials speculating in land : with our native Magistrates being allowed to secure. romiscuously, more land than they can possibly have use for. However, we certainly regard it as most beneficial to this Country that all officials should have the on for their own purposes and we are confident, were this generally adconnect, were this generally admitted many of our officials would look upon this country as a home, whereas now 99 % are only looking upon the old country, where they Penates as their home and are for ever looking forward to the day when they have completed their work in Last Africa to leave this country.
