WHIT MONDAY IN MOMBASA.

EDITORIAL.

It has often occurred to me how difficult it must be for many East Africans who are living in far away outstations to find some sort of recreation to pass their unemployed time. I have knowledge of an excellent method of collecting butterflies, which does away with the tedious and costly business of collecting these beautiful creatures, when I say collecting butterflies, I am not quite correct, I mean collecting the wings of butterflies. I am confident if those inclined towards Lepidoptera will try the following as a means of passing away a portion of their time, they will be very satisfied with the result. After catching a species of butterfly, cut off the wings close to the body. Set these in the natural way on any ordinary piece of white paper, which has been previously gummed with as white and liquid a gummed as possible. Next bend the paper, wet with gum, over so that both sides of the wings are in contact with the gum. Rub over the paper, now bent, with a penholder or better still, your Anatomical Needle. On opening the fold the feathers of both the upper and underside of the wings will be found to be left beautifully impressed on the gummed paper and the wings can be thrown away almost colorless. When the gum is dry, the picture may be washed over in the same way as an ordinary pencil drawing and the colours will remain fast for all time. I have seen some beautiful albums made in this way and I am of the opinion that they

are as useful to science as the preservation of the insect itself. To make the picture (which is really a part of the insect itself and faithfully delineates even the vein markings of the wings) complete, take any ordinary water-colour paint and paint in the body and antennae. There is no need to be an artist to paint the body of a butterfly.

It must be generally realized that the duty of a Sovereign is of very painful reform more especially in cases of the dismissal or in the acceptance of the resignation of an old and well tried servant. In quite recent days we have the "Curzon" case of India and the "Eliot" case of our own country. In the former case, His Majesty, the King, came to the conclusion that it was in the interest of the whole Empire that Lord Curzon's resignation should be accepted as it was undoubtedly the wisest course for his subjects in the Indian Empire. What set the minds of the Indian people against their Viceroy so strongly and so to speak, a sort of cult to grasp though we can trace the first intimation to the "Duke of Darbar." At this Darbar Lord Curzon was the first people of the Indian Empire and that F.R.H. the Duke and Duchess of Connaught, came second in precedence. Whether the Viceroy was right or wrong does not concern me but I know the Indian people (whose opinions on the questions of Royal Blood have been so imbedded for centuries) greatly resented the places accorded to His Royal Highness the Duke of Connaught and his Royal Consort. The intricacies of administrative procedure were too deep for these Eastern people to follow them. In the case of our own Commissioner Sir Charles Eliot, his resignation was accepted because the whole truth was not known to King Edward. What brought this to my mind this week was the letter of our late guest which addressed to the late Duke of Cambridge. Of all the interesting reading in Colonel Willoughby Verney's work on the life of the Duke recently published by Murray, I found nothing which appealed to me so much as the diplomatic letter from a Sovereign to a subject on a vital question. The letter reads: Windsor Castle, May 19, 1865. "My Dear George—Since seeing you on Thursday I have given much serious thought to the question of your tenure of the office of Commander-in-Chief. I quite appreciate the reasons which make you reluctant to resign the office which you have so long held with the greatest advantage to the army, and with my most entire confidence and approval. I have, however, come to the conclusion, on the advice of my ministers, that considerable changes in the distribution of duties among the holders of my army are desirable. These alterations cannot be effected without reconstituting the particular duties assigned to the Commander-in-Chief, and, therefore, I have decided that you should have arrived at the decision that, for your own sake as well as in the public interest, it is inexpedient that you should much longer retain that position, from which I think you should be relieved at the close of your Autumn duties. "This necessary change will be as painful to me as it is to you, but I am sure it is best so. Believe me, always your very affectionate cousin and friend, EDWARD VII.

The greatest rogue is a simple child when properly attacked, the expert pick-pocket takes a nerve and the world financier takes an interest in the tape as it is brought him direct from the "Marconi-graph." The discovery of this new cure claims absolute immunity for victims even in the roughest sea. One has read of cases innumerable which have taken a victim of standing on one's head and taking inwardly a continuous stream of champagne, "conversation water," as it is sometimes termed by the factious. None of the cures are really successful and therefore we would ask some of our readers who are shortly going on a sea trip to try the cure we give below and taking us to the result so that in case it is a successful cure, others may benefit from the experience. We gather our information from Chambers Journal, which obtains its information from the fountain head, Dr. Eugen Wolf, the cure is very simple, as all the ailments necessary are a couple of hot water at eighty degrees and a couple of handkerchiefs. One of the symptoms of sea-sickness is excessive thirst, which must not be assuaged if the patient has a craving for food he may be given a little dry toast and weak tea. Two hours after the cure the patient need not fear a hearty meal, smoking, or drinking. Those who undergo this treatment at the beginning of a voyage are never troubled with sea-sickness, even when the sea is very high.

neither verbally nor in writing formally inform the Collector of the alleged breach of the building regulations by the accused but took him to court. The Collector had the alleged breach brought to his notice by a letter from the Public Works Department which letter did not state that the accused was the owner of the building and therefore as far as we can gather the only evidence as to who the accused being owner or the creator of the building that the Collector had before him when taking out a criminal summons was the repetition of an alleged conversation between the said Superintendent of Revenue and the Accused, the date of which was given in court as May 29th which was before the building was erected. We can find no evidence whatsoever that the Collector between this date and June 18th, the date of the writ, made enquiries as to who was the owner of the land or as to who erected the building, from those very persons who must have been able to tell him. The Public Works Department could not probably have given him information. The Land Office could have given information as to who was the owner of the land, and the collector could have supplied the necessary information as to who paid for the erection and for the materials, wages, etc., and this is why we complain. We are of the opinion that if further reasonable enquiries had been made there never would have been any need to bring an innocent man before the court and put that person to the expense of engaging a counsel or for taking up the time of the court, which at present is undisturbed, to say nothing of the waste of time and temper which the action involved.

We hold that while Collectors or other Administrative Officers should at all times adhere to their duty they should always allow tact and diplomacy to influence them in the exercise of such duty and in particular in a young country like ours that tact and diplomacy form a considerable portion of the qualities of our Collector.

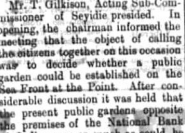
