Working During Wartime.

YEAR'S REVIEW.

The railway managers have been hard at work during the year under review. The Annual and General Meeting of Directors was held at the Hotel Metropole on August 4, 1914, the session being opened by the chairman, Mr. J. C. Fletcher. At the end of the meeting, a resolution was passed that "the Directors... do not consider that the war will last more than 18 months." This was a wise forecast, as the war has now continued for over two years. The Annual and General Meeting of Directors was again held at the Hotel Metropole on August 3, 1915. The chairman, Mr. T. J. Williams, said that the war had been fought "in the best interests of the Empire, and it is only natural that we should be anxious to do all we can to assist the war effort." He further said that the railway managers had done their duty in the best way possible, and he hoped that the Government would be satisfied with the services rendered.

KISUMU CAUSERIE

The special variations in the form of some of the 300 vessels which were granted the approval of the Board of Trade will be familiar to those who have followed the news. As a result of this, the Board have issued an order to the effect that "any vessel of British registry which has not obtained the necessary certificate must be taken out of service." This order applies to ships of all kinds, except those which have been granted certificates for their intended purpose.

This order was first issued on Septem-

ber 1, 1914, and the date for its strict observance was fixed for October 1, 1914. The 300 vessels which have been granted certificates will remain in service until January 1, 1916, at which time they will be required to be fitted with steam power. The remaining 200 vessels will be required to be converted to motor power by January 1, 1916, and will be required to have a minimum speed of 10 knots per hour. SINES OF WAR.

Pay for Victory.

NEED FOR THRU-T.

Every war budget is paid for while it is going on, taxes are correspondingly increased. It cannot be carried on with greater expense than the nation can afford to make by the next generation. We have to administer, clothe and feed for the troops, pay for the equipment of a fighting force, to buy the ships and food for the war on the fighters. And we have to pay for those things, but it has to be reduced and diminished.

If this is true of the stuff that is used in war, it is still more true of services needed in the war. There are services of all kinds, and of the categories of services, which are not directly related to the stuff required to sustain the war. All these services must be rendered at the cost of the war, and the cost of the war on the fighters. The politicians will say that certain parts do not prevent their being very useful, but they do not recognise these products exact money from the public war chest. It is said the public money was given to the fighters to pay for war, and of the cost of war, and not for the cost of the services. But the fighters left us a mass of stored up wealth, and shams and bonds that we can sell to raise money to pay for staff that they sent us for the war, and for the form of material property, such as ships, aeroplanes, tanks and railroads. That gives us power to pay for what we can do for the fighters.

To the extent that we can buy our services, or lend us money, we have

had a certain amount of paying back for the things that we need for the maintenance of necessary securities that gradually come up to us, so that we have to reduce.

Mr. E. G. Lewis, the Pennsylvania Railroad, before the U.S. Senate, New York, told the British Government in return for its loan of £20,000,000, "French loans have been extremely successful. If the British Government would take the task of repaying him to prevent his loss of money, he will have his money back." Very recently, when we can self-sacrifice, and borrow from others, to pay for the war, and willingness to do so, then the financial costs will be in proportion with the huge cost of the war.
