CINCHONA-BARK FROM GERMAN EAST AFRICA.

About the middle of last July s reliminary collection of bark from the oldest plants in the cinchonsgardens at Amani was made, and the 20 kilos. of bark derived from a hybrid of C. Ledgeriana and C. suc-cirubra was submitted for examina-tion to Dr. Oswald Hesse, director of the quinine-factory in Feuerbach near Stuttgart. One sample yielded 6.47 per cent. of quinine sulphate, and the second 6.8 per cent., with an additional 1.93 per cent. of secondary alkaloids in which no cinchonidine could be found. The secondary alkaloids in the first sample were not examined. The trees were grown at a height of about 3,000 ft.
