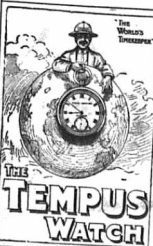

Some arguments are made above the suspicion of German inspiration—have tried to show that Germany cannot be completely defeated, that a great nation can not be exterminated. Obviously the whole population of Germany could not be crushed out of all national shape. If we cherished the senseless desire to crush it in such a way. But the German military machine can be broken, the Allies can impose their just terms, and an army of occupation—established in Germany, if necessary, for fifty years—can see that these terms are fulfilled. Clearly, Germany cannot pay, in money, the price of a world ruin she has wrought, but, as some economists have already pointed out, she can pay in lives. We know how Germany, herself, treats a conquered nation. She has seen no wrong in compelling the helpless people of Belgium to labour in her service for four years. When the day comes, Belgium can justly demand that Germany shall restore the whole of her peace. The German nation cannot be extinguished, but it can be compelled to give some of its wrong it has done, and it can be compelled to make its share in the progress of a civilized world. Her remedies may be needed, for Germany is suffering from a disease which demands drastic treatment.
